

Dear Sir:

We hereby make application to you for the appointment of Robt. H. C. Marchant as water commissioner for the Sand Wash stream.

We understand that Mr. Marchant will be made commissioner for the Sand Wash only, and we will not be required to pay such a large amount as compared to the other interested parties, as was the case last year.

Some time ago Mr. Marchant discussed with us the situation in connection with the refusal of Ira B. Cannon and Fred Case to abide by the State Engineer's regulation. Mr. Marchant showed us a letter received from you in which you advised or suggested that the right action would be for Sand Wash Irrigation Company and the Dry Gulch Irrigation Company to enter civil suit against Mr. Cannon and injoin him from using the water except as he has a right under his filing.

Our officials have discussed this matter some, and in all probability we will enter suit. This matter will be determined definitely at our Directors' Meeting to be held June 5th.

Mr. Marchant also stated that he had been requested to ascertain the water requirements of the various appropriators on the Sand Wash for the season of 1928. We have not rendered such a report to Mr. Marchant but we will expect all the water available commencing very soon. Up until now we have been receiving ample water from the Dry Gulch creek and Lakefork River to supply our requirements.
