Dear Sir:

Submitted herewith is my 1964 Water Report. I started working as commissioner April 25, 1964 and made my last report August 30, 1964.

At the beginning of the season there was 16.70 Second Feet of water in the creek.

The water was slow in coming down because of the cold spring. At about May 26, the flow had built up to 82.02 inches.

I started measuring for the season and this is my report:

June 4	there was	83.40 second feet
June 11	there was	74.00 second feet
June 23	there was	90.00 second feet
July 3	there was	68.00 second feet
July 11	there was	55.00 second feet
July 18	there was	46.00 second feet

The reservoirs were opened, Old Emery, Spinners, and Brush.
July 25 there was 55.00 second feet
On July 28 the Julious reservoir was released, it ran to August 15. Larsens never did drain it being plugged by beavers.

July 30	there was	48.00 second feet
August 1	there was	53.00 second feet
August 8	there was	56.00 second feet
August 10	there was	58.00 second feet
August 13	there was	56.00 second feet
August 17	there was	53.00 second feet
August 22	there was	29.50 second feet
August 25	there was	27.00 second feet
August 30	there was	24.50 second feet

September 18 I went with the Game Warden and member of canal board up to check Larsens reservoir and unplug it. We were rained out,.The next day I went with canal board and unplugged the reservoir, and cleaned the ditch.

I later got a report that the beavers had again plugged off the reservoir, I went up again and unplugged it. The Game Warden then trapped some beavers, they are giving us some trouble in our system.

The crops were considered good for the amount of rainfall we had. Most of the farmers got two crops of hay. The grain yield was good.

The two companies have consolidated and have made new certificates for all water share holders.

This is my report for 1964.
