The stockwatering rights on the Grassy Trail Creek are 1st Priority, 1870. The first priority Decreed right is 1878. The stock rights must be delivered if water is available in the creek ahead of other rights, unless upon release the flows will not reach the user. Our discussion covered the area from Grassy Trail Reservoir to the Biggs property west of town. They are as follows in descending order down the creek beginning at the reservoir.
