Re: Ground-water Districts for Pahvant Valley

Dear Water User:

Since the public meeting that was held in Fillmore on February 24, 1994, I have received a number of comments concerning certain aspects of our ground-water management plan, particularly concerning a proposed change in the boundaries of the ground-water districts.

At that meeting, I outlined a change in district boundaries which I felt would be advantageous to administering the valley's water resources. These proposed boundaries were based on a consideration of pumping patterns and recharge sources.

Since this proposal was made, I have received a number of comments, in writing and in person, on this matter. Virtually all of the comments were negative. Most dealt with the possible economic consequences of the boundary proposal. For the past thirty years, it appears that a great many economic decisions and financial arrangements have been made based on the old district boundaries.

In light of these comments, I have decided to leave the ground-water district boundaries as they have been since 1965 and to incorporate said boundaries into the management plan.

This policy modification will be effective immediately.
