CEASE AND DESIST ORDER

Dear Mr. Jefferson:

On June 27, 1994, you were sent a Notice of Agency Action by this agency regarding an apparent illegal use of water on 400 acres of land located in Section 24, Township 20 South, Range 5 West, SLB&M. Since that date, personnel of this agency have conducted further field inspections of the land in question. Also, you have not shown any evidence that there are valid water rights for the acreage in question. Nor have you filed a change application. Therefore, it is determined that you are using water on lands for which you do not have a valid water right.

Pursuant to Section 73-2-1 of the Utah Code, you are hereby **ORDERED to immediately cease and desist the use of water on said acreage.** Failure to comply with this order will result in this matter being referred to the Attorney General's Office for legal action.

This Order is subject to the provisions of Rule R655-6-17 of the Division of Water Rights and to Sections 63-46b-13 and 73-3-14 of the Utah Code Annotated, 1953 as amended, which provide for filing either a Request for Reconsideration with the State Engineer, or an appeal with the appropriate District Court. A Request for Reconsideration must be filed with the State Engineer within 20 days of the date of this Order. However, a Request for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for a court appeal. A court appeal must be filed within 30 days after the date of this Order, or if a Request for Reconsideration has been filed, within 30 days after the date the Request for Reconsideration is denied. A Request for Reconsideration is considered denied when no action is taken 20 days after the Request is filed.
