Dear Ms. Christensen:

On February 24, 1994, a public meeting was held in the Commissioner's Chambers at the Millard County Courthouse in Fillmore. At that meeting, the Pahvant Valley water users were given notice that a ground-water management plan was being instituted in Pahvant Valley. As part of that plan, water users were informed that water right irrigated acreage limits would be enforced. As part of that enforcement effort, investigations into the use of water on lands without valid water rights are being conducted.

Division of Water Rights personnel have determined, through technical means and field inspections, that it appears you are irrigating 19 acres of land located in Section 2, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, SLB&M for which no valid water right is known to exist.

They can assist you in verifying the extent of your water rights. If you plan on irrigating these same acres next year, they can assist you in filing any necessary change applications which may be appropriate. If you do not show the Division of Water rights that you, in fact, have a valid water right for the acreage in question, or if you do not have an approved change application before the beginning of the 1995 irrigation season, you will be ordered to cease the use of water on any illegal acreage.

I strongly urge you to give this matter your immediate attention.
