DECREE

This cause having been brought under the provisions of Chapter 67, Session Laws of Utah, 1919, for the purpose of having determined the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of Sevier River and its tributaries, including springs and wells, all of which are hereinafter referred to as the Sevier River System.

And the State Engineer of the State of Utah having made and filed herein his proposed determination of the rights in the use of the waters of said Sevier River System, as provided by law, and the Court having heard and determined all objections filed to said proposed determination, and having considered and determined all rights in the use of the waters of said Sevier River System, set out in the proposed determination of said State Engineer, and set out in the stipulations filed herein, and having filed herein its Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law,

NOW THEREFORE, by reason of the law and the findings aforesaid, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED as follows:

That excepting the storage rights hereinafter decreed to the Piute Reservoir and Irrigation Company and the Sevier Bridge Reservoir Companies, the said Sevier River System for the purpose of the distribution and the use of the waters thereof shall be and is hereby divided into two zones, A and B. Zone A shall include all rights where the waters of said Sevier River System shall be diverted above the dam of the Vermillion Canal Company situate in Sevier County. Zone B shall include all rights where the waters of said Sevier River System shall be diverted below the said dam of the said Vermillion Canal Company; that all rights herein provided for the use of the waters of said Sevier River System in Zone A and all rights provided for the use of the waters of said Sevier River System in Zone B shall be, so far as said zones are concerned, independent of each other; provided, however, that all rights herein provided for the use of the waters of

said Sevier River System, except the storage rights hereinabove mentioned, to be diverted in Zone A, are primary to and shall have priority over all rights herein determined in the use of the waters of said Sevier River System to be diverted in Zone B.

It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that beneficial use shall be the basis, the measure and the limitation of all rights to the use of the waters of said Sevier River System herein determined.

ZONE A
Chapter I

For the purposes of this decree and for the purpose of determining priorities and rights of proration, all rights in the use of the waters of said Sevier River System which are mentioned and set out in Stipulation Exhibit "C", and in the amendment to said Stipulation, Exhibit "C1", filed herein, and as set out in the Findings of the Court affecting said rights filed herein, are divided into Sections A, B, C, D, and E.

It is hereby ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the parties to this action as set out under the following sections A, B, C, D, and E, are the owners of the right to the use of the waters of said Sevier River System, within said respective sections, and are entitled to have distributed to them waters of said Sevier River System for the purpose and in the quantities and for the periods of time of use as follows, to-wit:

Said water to be diverted from Sevier River at a point 3070 feet west and 460 feet south of the northeast corner of sec. 27, T. 25 S., R 4 W., into the Sevier Valley Canal, and to be used upon lands located in Sevier County.

Any or all waters to be distributed as herein provided under said rights (a) to (1) inclusive, may, at the option of the owners and users thereof, be stored in the reservoir of the Piute Reservoir & Irrigation Company during any or all of said period from April 1st to September 30th both inclusive, in each and every year, and shall be stored and released from said reservoir without further compensation therefor than as herein provided.

All said waters so stored shall be released to the owners and users thereof, without diminution or delay, on their demand, at any time and from time to time, as herein provided, and be distributed under the supervision of the Sevier River Water Commissioner.

All waters so stored shall be so released and distributed at any time between April 1st and November 1st of each year, provided that:

(a) Owners and users of said rights shall have the right to draw on anticipated storage credits commencing with March 1st and ending with April 30th of any year.

(b) Water drawn upon anticipated storage credit shall not exceed that amount which such user or owner can and will safely repay during the period of time storage water is being released from Piute Reservoir and turned down to Sevier Bridge Reservoir.

(c) Any water drawn against anticipated storage shall be drawn from water stored in the Piute Reservoir by the Piute Reservoir & Irrigation Company and the Sevier Bridge Reservoir owners under their storage filings, and not required by the owners thereof for immediate use.

(d) The Sevier River Water Commissioner, or Commissioners, if more than one Commissioner is acting, shall determine the amount of water that each owner or user may safely draw as anticipated storage credit, but in no event shall the total quantity drawn by all of said owners or users exceed 3000 acre feet. And it shall be the duty of said Commissioner, or Commissioners, to so regulate the use of the water by said owners or users, that any water drawn against anticipated storage credit will be repaid from any water to which said users may be entitled during the period of time storage water is being released from the Piute Reservoir and turned down to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir.

(e) All water stored by said owners and users not so released and remaining in said reservoir on the first of November of any year shall be forfeited to the Piute

Reservoir & Irrigation Company and to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir users as their respective interests may appear as hereinafter provided.

In addition to the rights herein provided for the Annabella Irrigation Canal Company, said company shall be entitled to divert from the Sevier River above the Annabella Dam a maximum of three second feet of water, to be used for culinary, domestic and/or stockwatering purposes between October 1st and October 31st, both inclusive, provided there shall be, during said period, no storage water to the credit of said company; and the said Annabella Irrigation Company shall be entitled to divert from the Sevier River, above the Annabella Dam, a maximum of 15 c.f.s. of water, to be used for the irrigation of pasture land during the periods between November 1st and November 20th, both inclusive, and March 16th and March 30th, both inclusive; provided that said Annabella Irrigation Canal Company is not to divert or use any Sevier River water during the period between November 21st and March 15th, both dates inclusive.

Sevier Valley Canal Company: From October 16th to November 25th, both inclusive, twenty per cent of the flow of Sevier River between the two Kingston gauging stations, as now located, one on the east fork of the Sevier River, and the other on the south fork of the Sevier River, including all water passing over each said station, and the dam of the Annabella Irrigation Company; provided there shall not be distributed under this right more than 63.14 c.f.s.

Utah Idaho Sugar Company: To be diverted from Sevier River through the canal of the said Richfield Irrigation Canal Company, to be used only for washing beets during times when the mill of said company shall be in operation.

Vermillion Irrigation Company (sometimes called Vermillion Canal Company): All of the waters of the Sevier River accumulating therein between the Annabella Dam and the Vermillion Dam, not exceeding 37.80 c.f.s., with period of use from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, provided, however, that whenever the waters yielded between the Annabella Dam and the Vermillion Dam during the irrigation period, that is, from April 1 to September 30, both dates inclusive, shall not be sufficient to supply to said Vermillion Irrigation Company the said 37.80 c.f.s., then the rights hereinbefore mentioned and set out as primary rights under Section A Sevier County shall pro rate equally with the said Vermillion Canal Company.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the words "accumulating" and "yielded" are

defined in said award to the Vermillion Irrigation Company to mean the amount of water which the river yields or makes between the Annabella Dam and the Vermillion Dam, and does not include water yielded and flowing in the Sevier River above the Annabella Dam and which passes over the said Annabella Dam, except such quantity of water, if any, as the Vermillion Irrigation Company may be entitled to under the proration provisions herein contained during the irrigation season, that is, between April 1 and September 30, both dates inclusive, in each and every year, and including during said irrigation season, its proportion of the 22 second feet stipulated as the make of the river between the two Kingston gauging stations and the gauging station known as "Sevier River Below Piute Dam".

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that during the non-irrigation season, to-wit: from October 1 to March 31, inclusive, the Vermillion Irrigation Company is not entitled to pro rate with any other users, but is entitled during said period only to such water as the river yields or makes between the Annabella Dam and the Vermillion Dam, unless such quantity be insufficient to satisfy its domestic, stock watering and culinary needs, in which event the Sevier River commissioner or commissioners shall divert to it from the waters passing or flowing over the Annabella Dam such additional water as in the judgment of said Commissioner or commissioners shall be necessary to satisfy such needs, which total quantity for said purposes shall not exceed 15 c.f.s.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that it was the intention of the parties signing the stipulation Exhibit C, that the period of time during which the Vermillion Canal Company shall be entitled to call on the primary users mentioned and set out as primary users under Section A of said stipulation Exhibit C, to pro rate with it, is the irrigation period, that is, from April 1 to September 30, both dates inclusive, of each year, and it was the intention of said parties that there shall be no proration when the natural flow of the river, during said irrigation season, is sufficient to give the primary users designated in Section A thereof, including the Vermillion Irrigation Company, 100 per cent of their rights as herein set out.

Monroe South Bend Canal Company: as a primary right against all parties to Section A Sevier County

Provided that from October 16th to March 31st, inclusive, 37 c.f.s. of said 41.50 c.f.s., and from April 1st to April 30th, inclusive, 30 c.f.s. thereof, are primary rights as against all parties to Section A Sevier County.

All said waters to be diverted from Sevier River at a point 3500 feet west and 1750 feet south of the northeast corner of sec. 27, T. 25 S. R. 4 W., into the South Bend Canal, and to be used upon lands located in Sevier County.

There shall be distributed to the rights herein decreed in Section (A) hereof as the make of the Sevier River between the two Kingston gauging stations and the gauging station known as "Sevier River below the Piute Dam" as now located below the dam of the Piute Reservoir, 22 second feet of water during the irrigation season, - that is April 1st to September 30th of each year; provided that said 22 second feet of water shall not be taken from water stored within said reservoir by the owners of primary rights, or from Otter Creek water stored in the Piute Reservoir, but any deficiency in said 22 second feet shall be made up only from water therein accruing from the storage filings of the Piute Reservoir & Irrigation Company Nos. 296, 1534 and 1624, or the storage filings of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir users, but this shall not constitute a limitation upon the right of the owners of such storage water to draw and use the same. Whenever there shall not be in said reservoir, or in said section of the river, a sufficient quantity of water to supply the said 22 second feet and the 12 second feet herein decreed to the Piute Reservoir & Irrigation Company from three-fourths of the Barnson Springs, then the said 22 second feet and the 12 second feet shall pro rate.

CULINARY AND DOMESTIC USE

In addition to the rights hereinabove set out under "Section A" hereof, the owners and users thereof, except as hereinabove otherwise provided, shall have the right to such use of the waters of Sevier River and its tributaries as may be reasonably necessary for culinary, domestic and/or stockwatering purposes, to be distributed to them under the supervision of the Sevier River Water Commissioner, at their said respective points of diversion, during the remainder of each year, where use is not herein provided for irrigation purposes.

Whenever the waters available for distribution in said river, flowing in said Section A, are insufficient to supply all the waters of each class therein, then each class shall have precedence in their order as herein set out, and the rights of each party in each said class shall be diminished pro rata.

The upper or southerly pond at an early date was small. Thereafter, it increased in size and in the amount of water. The amount is variable reaching high points between 1920 and 1925 and diminishing thereafter. During high water periods, or when there is excessive irrigation above the ponds, the said pond increased to such an extent that there was a surplus water and that the surplus water so accumulating was at times used by the Avery Irrigation Company and whenever there arises surplus water in said pond the Avery Irrigation Company, is entitled to the use of such surplus.

The Spring Hill Irrigation Company, has a diversion point from the said upper or southerly pond, and has diverted waters from this point of diversion upon lands owned by the Spring Hill Irrigation Company. The diversion channel being of the approximate capacity of 10 sec. ft. of water.

The court finds that the Spring Hill Irrigation Company is entitled to divert water from the upper or southerly pond when the pond is at its normal height and its normal flow up until they have received water to the capacity of their canal. Thereafter, the surplus water above the capacity of said canal shall flow down the cut into the old drain used by the Avery Irrigation Company.

A gate and weir should be placed in said pond at the location of the old drain. This gate to be under the supervision of the Water Commissioner appointed by this court to be constructed under the supervision of the Water Commissioner in such a way that it will not interfere with the original right of the Spring Hill Irrigation Company, but will permit the drawing off of the surplus and high water from the southerly or upper pond and also afford a means of measuring said surplus water.

The Spring Hill Irrigation Company is entitled to the waters from the second pond. The company is required to place a gate and weir between the second or center pond, and the lower or northerly pond of the said three ponds. And the water from the center of second pond is to be measured into and out of the lower or third pond. Said gate and weir between the second or center pond and the third or northerly pond shall be constructed at the expense of the Spring Hill Irrigation Company, due allowance is authorized for loss and evaporation in the measurement of the water going into and out of the third or lower pond.

The Spring Hill Irrigation Company, may at its option, either before the installation of such gate and weir or at any time thereafter, divert the waters of said second or center pond directly into

its own irrigation system and without allowing the same to flow into said northerly pond, said change to be made at the expense of the said Spring Hill Irrigation Company.

The Spring Hill Irrigation Company is not entitled to any waters of the lower or northerly pond, except the waters which are measured in from the second or center pond.

The Avery Irrigation Company is entitled to the first right to the use of the waters of the lower or northerly pond until their right or the capacity of their ditch, which is 8 sec. ft. has been reached. After that right has been satisfied, the HEPPLER right, with priority of 1890, and subsequent to the Avery right is to be satisfied.

FRANK J. HEPPLER is entitled to the use of the ponds for fish culture; that he must use reasonable diligence so as to not unnecessarily interfere with the prior rights as herein set forth.

In connection with the above right it is hereby ordered that as between the West Point Irrigation Company and the Island Irrigation Company, a Mutual Association, otherwise called the Bagnall Ditch Company, waters of the Sanpitch River at and near what is known as the Bagnall Dam in Sanpete County shall be divided as follows:

From February 24 to the last day of February, both days inclusive, the West Point Irrigation Company is entitled to 3 c.f.s. (2) From Timber Canyon Creek at a point 1500 feet E. and 280 feet S. of the NE corner Sec. 14, T. 17 S., R. 1 W. into the Timber Canyon Ditch.

DOMESTIC AND STOCK WATERING:

(b) 2.00 c.f.s. Priority: 1875. Period of Use: October 15 to March 1. Point of Diversion: Same as described in paragraph (a).

In the interpretation of the provisions of this decree under Chapter Five, the following rules must prevail unless it is specifically provided herein to the contrary:

1. That priorities, as to the use of waters, shall apply to each particular tributary with respect to which the priority of use is given, and the same shall not be applied to the priorities upon Sanpitch River unless a different meaning is apparent from the specific language of any award.

2. Where there has been awarded by this decree with respect

to any particular rights, a maximum and a minimum quantity, the maximum quantity has been determined on a duty of 40 acres to the second foot during the high water period which is to be construed to be the period wherein the water supply is sufficient to give to all lands upon the particular tributary or stream or source a full supply on such duty irrespective of priority. After the water supply is insufficient to fill the rights as hereinabove stated, then the duty shall be raised to 60 acres to the second foot and shall be distributed upon such basis until the supply of such stream or source is insufficient to fill all rights under the 60 acre to the second foot duty, then the junior or subsequent appropriations, or rights, shall be barred in order of priority from further diverting water until said source of supply again increases to such volume as will fill such subsequent appropriator's rights as hereinabove set out, providing, however, that said increase in flow comes within the period of use set out in this decree.

CHAPTER SIX

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Piute Reservoir and Irrigation Company, a corporation, State Board of Land Commissioners of the State of Utah, (herein called the owners of Piute Reservoir); and the Abraham Irrigation Company, a corporation, Deseret Irrigation Company, a corporation, Delta Canal Company, a corporation, Central Utah Water Company, a corporation, and Melville Irrigation Company, a corporation, (herein called the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir), are the owners of the right to store and use all of the waters yielded by the said Sevier River for satisfying their rights under applications designated as No. 296, made March 14, 1905; No. 1534, made August 16, 1907; and No. 1624, made October 21, 1907; in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah, and under the so-called Hawley Filing made by Jacob C. Hawley on August 26, 1902, and under applications to appropriate water designated as No. 1367 A, made May 10, 1907; No. 1367 A-1, made May 10, 1907; and No. 4562, made March 19, 1912; in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah. It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the record owner or owners of each of said applications and filings on which final proof has not been made shall make final proof of appropriation of water to a beneficial use and purpose, at its own cost and expense, within the time prescribed by law or any extension or extensions of said time authorized by the order of any court having jurisdiction; and in the event of a failure of any of said parties so to do, any of the other owners of said Piute Reservoir or said Sevier Bridge Reservoir may at any time within 60 days prior to the time allowed for making such final proof do so at the expense of the defaulting party, unless said parties shall all agree in writing to the abandonment of any said applications. The final proof herein provided for, and any change of place or storage or use of any water in-

cluded in said filings and covered by this decree, shall be subject and subordinate to and shall in no way effect the allocation of said waters as herein decreed.

As between the owners of the Piute Reservoir and the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that all the waters of the Sevier River yielded above the Sevier Bridge Dam from all and every source whatever, available for storage or use under their or any of their said water filings between October 1st of any year and October 1st of the succeeding year, the following priorities and allocations of amounts shall govern:

FIRST:

Sevier Bridge Reservoir to receive eighty-nine thousand two hundred and eighty (89,280) acre feet;

SECOND:

Piute Reservoir to receive forty thousand (40,000) acre feet;

THIRD:

After the first and second above priorities and amounts have been satisfied, then of the next 32,000 acre feet, or any part thereof available, seventy-five (75%) percent shall be allocated to Sevier Bridge Reservoir, and twenty-five (25%) percent to the Piute Reservoir;

FOURTH:

Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall receive all or any part of the next thirteen thousand seven hundred twenty (13,720) acre feet available;

FIFTH:

Thereafter, of the next 75,000 acre feet, or any part thereof available, seventy-five (75%) percent shall be allocated to Sevier Bridge Reservoir and twenty-five (25%) percent to Piute Reservoir;

SIXTH:

All other or further water available shall be allocated eighty-five (85%) percent to Sevier Bridge Reservoir and fifteen (15%) percent to the Piute Reservoir.

The amount of water in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir and in the Piute Reservoir, respectively, shall be measured and determined by the water level in each reservoir on April 15th of each and every year; the capacity of the reservoirs shall be the effective surface storage capacity, exclusive of any so-called bank-storage, and the amount of water therein shall be determined by the record data of surveys heretofore made and now used by the Sevier River Water Commissioner for computing the amount of storage in each reservoir, until such time as a joint survey of one or both of said reservoirs may be had; after which time the capacities at the various water levels, as determined by such joint survey, shall control, until a re-survey shall be adopted by the court as hereinafter provided. From the amount of water thus measured and determined in each of said reservoirs, respectively there shall be deducted any hold-over storage and/or any primary flow

storage, and there shall be added any water used by direct flow under any of the said filing, and the balance, after such deductions respectively, shall constitute the water available for division under this decree. Whenever it shall appear on the 15th day of April of any year that there is stored in the said Sevier Bridge Reservoir, after proper allowance for the above mentioned additions and deductions, less than its first priority of 89,280 acre feet, or less than its proportion of the total storage allocated to it under this decree, then the difference between said lesser amount and the allotment to the said Sevier Bridge Reservoir under this decree, as determined on the 15th of April of each year, less the amount thereafter available to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, under said filings from the flow of the river shall be by the owners of the Piute Reservoir delivered into the Sevier Bridge Reservoir without deduction or loss, when and as needed by the owners of water rights under the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, and the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall be the exclusive judges of their needs and necessities. It is the intention under this decree, however, that storage hereunder shall so far as practicable be made concurrently, and that any such excess water shall be held in the Piute Reservoir as long as practicable, consistent with the necessities of the Sevier Bridge water users, in order that the make of the river, in excess of primary rights, may be given as long a time as possible to supply such deficiency. Water owing Sevier Bridge Reservoir by Piute Reservoir shall be measured as close to the back water of Sevier Bridge Reservoir as is practicable.

Provided, however, that on or before the first day of April of any year on demand of the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, the Sevier River Commissioner or Commissioners shall measure and determine the amount of water available in the Piute Reservoir and in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir to satisfy the prior rights of the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir. If said measurement and determination shall show that the quantity of water stored in said two reservoirs and all accruals thereto will be less in amount than is necessary to satisfy the prior rights of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, then and in that event the Water Commissioner or Commissioners shall upon demand of the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, at any time on or after April 1st of any year, cause the waters so stored in the Piute Reservoir and belonging to the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir to be turned down into the Sevier Bridge Reservoir but with the further provision that such demand and such release of water from the Piute Reservoir shall not be in derogation of the rights of the primary users in the Sevier Valley to anticipate storage, as such rights are fixed by the separate provisions of this decree.

Any owner of either the Piute Reservoir or Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall, after sixty days notice in writing to all other owners, and at its own expense, be permitted to make or have made a re-survey of the said reservoirs, or either of them; and upon the completion of such re-survey any owner may make appli-

cation to this court to have the re-survey adopted for controlling reservoir capacities, under which the allocation of water shall be made as herein provided. Upon the filing of any such application, the court shall fix the time for hearing and give notice thereof to all owners of both reservoirs; upon the hearing, any owner of either reservoir may be heard, and the court shall, if such re-survey be found to be correct, by order adopt the same as controlling the capacity of the reservoir or reservoirs for the allocation of waters hereunder; provided, however, that such re-surveys for control purposes may not be made oftener than once every five years. As of May 8, 1933, and hereafter until modified by order of this court, the capacity of said Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall be determined in accordance with the following capacity table:

That between April 15th and October 1st of each year, all water available for storage in either reservoir over and above primary or direct flow rights, and the amount of water awarded to the Deseret Irrigation Company, and the Abraham Irrigation Company for second filling of the Gunnison Bend Reservoir, shall be added to the amounts found to be stored in said reservoirs and

available for distribution under this decree on April 15th, and shall constitute the total available storage supply for allocation under this decree as between the two said reservoirs. Any water properly subject to allocation to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir under this decree accumulating in the Piute Reservoir or credited to the same after April 15th, shall be turned down to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir in the same fashion and subject to the same conditions as hereinabove provided with respect to any excess storage in the Piute Reservoir prior to April 15th.

That any water left in the Piute Reservoir, or in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, on October 1st of each year, except such water, if any, that may be due Sevier Bridge Reservoir from the Piute Reservoir under this decree, is herein designated as holdover water, and shall belong absolutely to the reservoir in which it is held, and shall not be taken into consideration in the allocation of water for the following year. All water owing Sevier Bridge Reservoir by Piute Reservoir shall be delivered into Sevier Bridge Reservoir as of October 1st in each and every year.

That the Deseret Irrigation Company, the Abraham Irrigation Company and the Central Utah Water Company shall be entitled to the direct diversion of the primary water now owned by them and awarded under the "Higgins decree" beginning March 1st of each and every year, to the extent it is thereafter available in the river, and said parties shall have the right to use or store such water for future use by themselves or their exchanges as they may elect.

That none of the owners of Piute Reservoir except as hereinafter provided or Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall contract with any other owners or users of water of the Sevier River to use by direct diversion or store primary water for such other owners or users in either the Sevier Bridge Reservoir or the Piute Reservoir prior to April 15th of any year, and provided further that none of the parties hereto will purchase for storage in either Piute Reservoir or Sevier Bridge Reservoir or Pool Creek Reservoir or for use by direct flow any of the primary or direct flow water rights of the Sevier River prior to April 15th of any year.

The Deseret Irrigation Company and the Abraham Irrigation Company shall be entitled to store and impound in Gunnison Bend Reservoir, during the non-irrigation season, the full capacity of said Reservoir, and to use or store any and all waters in excess of the capacity of the Reservoir and up to a maximum of ten thousand acre feet as shall arise below the spillway of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir; and shall be further permitted, during the high water season, to-wit, between April 1st and June 30th of each year, to impound or use, under said Gunnison Bend right, such quantity of water not in excess of ten thousand acre feet as may be available from the natural flow of the Sevier River in excess of all prior rights decreed in the Higgins decree.

The Deseret Irrigation Company shall not be entitled to the use of any water for the generation of water power for the opera-

tion of its Roller Mill near Oasis, Utah, except such water as may be awarded to parties owning the rights to the use of the Sevier River water and who divert and use the same below the Gunnison Bend Reservoir; and so far as the parties to this decree are concerned, it shall be entitled to use for said purpose any of the unappropriated waters of said Sevier River, if any there be.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that as between the Deseret Irrigation Company, Central Utah Water Company, Abraham Irrigation Company, Delta Canal Company and Melville Irrigation Company, that all the waters of the said Sevier River yielded below the Sevier Bridge Dam for satisfying their rights under their water filings Nos. 1367 A, 1367 A-1 and 4562 in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah, and any certificates based on said filings, shall be allocated and divided between the said parties as hereinafter specified; provided, however, that the award and allocation of said water yielded by said Sevier River below the said Sevier Bridge Dam shall not be construed as altering, modifying, enlarging or restricting the award, allocation and division of the waters heretofore allocated to the Piute Reservoir and to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir.

The Central Utah Water Company shall be the exclusive owner and shall be entitled to the exclusive use of said water covered by said filings below Sevier Bridge Dam and/or certificates from October 1st in each and every year until April 1st in each and every succeeding year, and shall have the right to use the same by direct diversion and/or store and impound the same for future use. During that period of time in each and every year, between April 1st and October 1st, the said water and the use of the same shall belong exclusively to and be used by the Delta Canal Company, Deseret Irrigation Company, Melville Irrigation Company, Abraham Irrigation Company and Central Utah Water Company, and shall be apportioned and divided among themselves in the following proportions.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the contract made and entered into on the 5th day of April, A. D. 1913, by and between the Delta Land & Water Company, a Nevada corporation, Deseret Irrigation Company, a Utah corporation, Sevier River Land and Water Company, a Utah corporation, and the Melville Irrigation Company, a Utah corporation, commonly known as the Four-Party contract, is hereby reaffirmed and declared legal and binding upon said parties and their successors in interest, and they shall not jointly or severally or at all, at any time, contest the legality of said Four-Party contract or any of the terms or provisions of the same.

At the option of any party hereto exercizable at any time, the

Central Utah Water Company shall immediately segregate and assign to the Deseret Irrigation Company, Melville Irrigation Company, and Abraham Irrigation Company all of the right, title and interest of each of said companies in and to water filing No. 1367 A in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah as their interest appears by the said Four-Party Contract, and assign to the Delta Canal Company, Melville Irrigation Company, Deseret Irrigation Company and Abraham Irrigation Company all of the right, title and interest of each of said companies in and to water filing No. 4562 in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah as their interest appears by the said Four-Party Contract, it being understood that the interest of the Central Utah Water Company, the Deseret Irrigation Company, Melville Irrigation Company and Abraham Irrigation Company in and to water filing No. 1367 A is as follows:

And that each of said companies shall make proof in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah of their respective interests in each of said filings within the time allowed by law or any extensions, and if any company fails within sixty days previous to the time allowed to make final proof of its interest in its segregated water filings as provided by law, or any extension of time, then and in that event any other of said parties may do so at the cost and expense of the defaulting party.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that as between the Delta Canal Company, Deseret Irrigation Company, Melville Irrigation Company, Abraham Irrigation Company, and Central Utah Water Company, that whenever the water available for storage in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, as set forth in this decree, shall be 104,000 acre feet or less in any one season, that the said Companies, pursuant to the provisions of what is commonly known as the "Four-Party Contract", shall participate in and own the waters so stored in the following percentages:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the division and allocation of all of the waters arising in or flowing into the Sevier River in the lower zone, that is, between the Vermillion Dam as now located in the Northwest quarter of Section 32, Township 23 South, Range 2 West, and the Delta Gauging station as now located in the Northwest quarter of Section 27, Township 16 South, Range 7 West, Salt Lake Meridian, approximately 6½ miles northeast of the town of Delta, shall be as follows:

The right of the Abraham Irrigation Co. represented by its application No. 1176, certificate No. 78 B with period of use from March 1 to July 1 of each and every year, and a priority date as of January 8, 1907, shall be satisfied out of waters yielded by the Sevier River in the lower zone as hereinbefore defined, after all prior rights are satisfied in full.

That the Rocky Ford Canal Company, a corporation, shall be entitled to 16,000 acre feet and the Willow Bend Irrigation Company, a corporation, shall be entitled to 8,000 acre feet of the waters yielded by said Sevier River between Vermillion Dam as now located in the Northwest quarter of Section 32, Township 23 South, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, and the Rocky Ford Dam as now located in the Northeast quarter of Section 19, Township 22 South, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Meridian, between April 1 and October 15 of each and every calendar year; provided further that the Rocky Ford Canal Company and the Willow Bend Irrigation Company shall be entitled to store jointly during the month of March, out of the waters so yielded, in their reservoir above the Rocky Ford Dam, not to exceed 2,000 acre feet of water. The water so stored shall be used only between April 1 and October 15 of the same calendar year and such storage shall be charged against the season's total supply of said 24,000 acre feet, and said companies may release the same for use in any quantity at any time between said dates, providing said storage does not exceed at any one time 2,000 acre feet.

That the above quantity of water decreed to the Rocky Ford Canal Company and to the Willow Bend Irrigation Company shall not be subject to use or transfer for use upon lands lower down the river than the lands available for use under the present canals

of the said companies respectively.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that any and all water that passes said Vermillion Dam having been yielded by the river in the upper zone, that is, above Vermillion Dam, from January 1 to December 31, inclusive, in each and every year, is hereby decreed to and allocated to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir and the said Piute Reservoir under the terms and provisions of this decree.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that from October 16 to March 31 following, any water diverted into the Rocky Ford Canal shall be for no other purpose than for culinary or stock watering use and the size of stream shall be consistent with culinary and stock watering needs and shall be diverted and used for such purposes only under the supervision of the Sevier River water commissioner, and shall be returned to the river without diminution except for necessary domestic and culinary use by the most practical route.

All water yielded in above section of the river between Vermillion Dam and Delta Gauging Station after the satisfaction of the rights of the Rocky Ford Canal Company and Willow Bend Irrigation Company are set out above and the AA rights herein decreed the right of direct diversion from the river as hereinafter specified, is hereby allocated first to satisfy primary rights, herein designated as A, B, C, D, E and F rights, and all the remainder, except well water rights as hereinafter set out, is hereby allocated and decreed to the Piute Reservoir and Sevier Bridge Reservoir under the terms of this decree. The water available to satisfy such primary rights shall be applied first to the satisfaction of A rights in full and thereafter to the satisfaction in turn of B, C, D, E and F rights respectively in full. No water shall go to the satisfaction of Class B or Class C or Class D or Class E or Class F rights unless and until there is in the river a quantity of water in excess of the water necessary to fully satisfy all prior classes and rights, irrespective of how much of such water belonging to the respective prior class or classes or rights shall be used by the owners of such prior class or classes or rights. If at any time there is not sufficient water available to satisfy in full any class, then and in that event the owners of the respective rights in any such class shall pro rate the water available for satisfying such class in proportion to the respective quantities each is entitled to use of such class, but the quantity of water to which any user within any class shall be entitled shall not be increased by the failure of any other user within such class to use or store, as decreed in this case, any of the water to which he or it is or would otherwise be entitled if it were not for this decree; and the water saved by reason of the failure of any primary or "AA" or well water user to use or store the water to which he or it is entitled or would otherwise be entitled to if it were not for the other provisions of the decree in this case, shall be allocated to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir and Piute Reservoir as hereinbefore

decreed. Any primary water stored and not used or drawn from the Sevier Bridge Reservoir during the current year that the same is stored shall be forfeited to the Sevier Bridge Reservoir and Piute Reservoir and allocated as storage water as provided in this decree; provided, however, that it shall be the duty of the river commissioner or other person charged with the duty of measuring and determining the quantities of water in said river available for users under this decree, to accurately measure said water and to file a statement in the office of the State Engineer on or before the 10th day of each calendar month, which statement shall show the quantity of stored primary water to which Deseret Irrigation Company, Abraham Irrigation Company and Central Utah Water Company were entitled as of the end of the preceding month, and provided further that said three Companies shall have to and including the 31st day of October in each year to withdraw any primary water owned by said Companies, or either of them, and stored in Sevier Bridge Reservoir prior to October 1st of any year, and provided further that if any of said companies fail to withdraw any portion of said stored primary water prior to November 1st in any year, the water so remaining on November 1st shall be forfeited by said Companies and shall remain in said reservoir and shall be allocated between the Sevier Bridge and Piute Reservoirs, as herein provided.

Any and all water accumulated in either the Sevier Bridge or Piute Reservoirs by virtue of primary waters stored and forfeited for non-use during any season, and any and all water in any way accumulated in said Reservoirs or otherwise, as water in excess of primary rights, as in this decree defined, shall be treated as storage water belonging to said Reservoirs under their filings, and shall be allocated and divided, as provided in this decree, and shall be held, released and otherwise administered in all respects as storage water under the provisions of this decree governing storage water accruing to the Piute Reservoir and the Sevier Bridge Reservoir under their respective filings.

The owners of above rights from A to F, inclusive, the amount of water to which they are severally entitled, subject to the limitations herein provided and the period of time each is entitled to the use of the water and the priority date under the same are as follows:

Provided, however, that of the 12.1 second feet owned by the Dover Irrigation Company to be used from March 1 to October 1, 6.3 second feet shall be delivered to the Central Utah Water Company and diverted from the Sevier River where the main canal of the Central Utah Water Company intersects the river and be used on lands under the canal system of the said Central Utah Water Company, and provided further that 5.8 second feet of the said 12.1 second feet from March 1 to October 1 shall be delivered to the Nicholson Seed Farms and diverted from the said Sevier River into their main canal where the same intersects Sevier River and be used for the irrigation of lands under the canal system of said Nicholson Seed Farms. Provided further that of the 45 second feet owned by the Dover Irrigation Company to be used from March 1 to October 15, 23.7 second feet thereof shall be delivered to the West View Irrigation Company and diverted from the river where the main canal of the said West View Irrigation Company intersects the Sevier River and be used for the irrigation of lands under the canal system of said West View Irrigation Company. Provided further that 1.2 second feet of the said 45 second feet owned by the said Dover Irrigation Company shall be delivered to J. W. Nielson or his successors and diverted from the Sevier River into the Gunnison-Fayette Canal where it intersects the Sevier River and shall be used by the said J. W. Nielson or his successors for the irrigation of his lands under the said Gunnison Fayette Canal. Provided further that the remaining 20.1 second feet of said 45 second feet owned by the Dover Irrigation Company shall be used by said company and diverted from the Sevier River where its main canal intersects Sevier River and be used for the irrigation of lands under the canal system of said Dover Irrigation Company.

The following rights not being the subject of pro rata division under rights above defined as A, B, C, D, E, and F, and being in their nature miscellaneous and independent and having their sources in springs and other tributaries of the Sevier River are hereby designated as AA rights, and are to be satisfied in full from the waters flowing in the Sevier River as hereinafter stated in lieu of the water directly available from such sources, and the water which said rights represent is to be used on lands as hereinafter set forth and are limited in season and quantity as follows:

AA rights:

1. West View Irrigation Company from Redmond Spring Creek 1.5 second feet to be used from April 1 to October 15 and to be diverted from the Sevier River through the West View Canal for use on lands under its said canal system.
2. Gunnison Fayette Canal Company, from the yield of San Pitch River below the intersection of the Gunnison Fayette Canal and San Pitch River, 1.4 second feet, to be used from March 1 to October 15 to be diverted through the Gunnison Fayette Canal and used on lands under its canal system.
3. A. H. Christensen, from Ryan Meadow springs, 1.0 second foot to be used from April 1 to October 15, to be diverted through the Gunnison Fayette Canal and used to irrigate lands under its canal system.
4. Howard Roberts, from Ryan Meadow springs, 0.7 second foot, and Archie M. Mellor, from Ryan Meadow springs, 0.7 second foot, to be used from April 1 to October 15, to be diverted into the Gunnison Fayette Canal and used to irrigate lands under its canal system.
5. Central Utah Water Company, from right decreed to L. H. Erickson in the Higgins decree, 3.3 second feet to be used from March 1 to October 1, to be diverted through the

Central Utah Water Company Canal and used to irrigate lands under its canal system.

6. Nicholson Seed Farms, from right decreed to Elizabeth Roberts, et al. in the Higgins decree, 1.4 second feet to be used from March 1 to October 1, to be diverted through its canals and used to irrigate lands under its canal system.

Well Rights

The following rights not being the subject of pro rata division under rights above defined as A, B, C, D, E, and F, and having their sources in wells as now driven adjacent to the Sevier River are hereby designated as "Well Water", and are hereby limited to the quantity of water available for satisfying their respective rights from their respective sources of supply.

A. Dover Dam Wells

West View Irrigation Company, the first 1.0 second foot yielded by the so-called Dover Dam Wells as now driven situated near the quarter-corner common to sections 24 and 25, Township 19 South, Range 1 West, to be used from April 1 to October 15 on lands under the West View Canal. Gunnison Valley Land & Livestock Co. is to have a maximum of 3 second feet additional water yielded by said wells to be used from April 1 to October 1 on lands under the Gunnison Fayette Canal system. Any additional water yielded by said wells shall be turned into the Sevier River and allocated as Sevier River Water.

B. Kearns Ranch Wells

To Gunnison Valley Land and Livestock Company a maximum of two second feet yielded by said wells as now driven and located in Section 1, Township 20 South, Range 1 West and Section 6, Township 20 South, Range 1 East, to be used from April 1 to October 1 on lands under the Gunnison Fayette Canal System. Any additional water yielded by said wells shall be turned into Sevier River and allocated as Sevier River water.

C. Spaulding Livingston Wells

To the Abraham Irrigation Company the water yielded by the Spaulding Livingston Wells as now driven and located in Sections 25 and 30, Township 19 South, Range 1 West, and Section 30, Township 19 South, Range 1 East, not exceeding a maximum of 15 second feet to be used from April 1 to October 1 through the Abraham Irrigation Company Canals for the irrigation of lands under its canal system. Any additional water yielded by said wells shall be turned into Sevier River and allocated as Sevier River water.

D. Sanpitch River Rights

To the Gunnison Fayette Canal Company, a maximum of 40 second feet of the water yielded by the Sanpitch River above the intersection of Gunnison Fayette Canal and Sanpitch River after all prior rights are satisfied above the said

intersection of Sanpitch River and the said Gunnison Fayette Canal, to be used from March 1 to October 1 on lands under the Gunnison Fayette Canal system north of the Sanpitch River.

The following named companies and individuals hereinafter called "Exchange Users", shall have the right annually from April 16 to October 10, inclusive, to divert from the river the following percentages of the water yielded by said river for satisfying their respective rights as specified in this paragraph and as follows, to-wit:

Provided that the said companies and individuals herein referred to as Exchange Users, shall each have the right to divert from the yield of the river below Vermillion Dam at their respective head gates any amount in second feet and at any time between April 16 and October 10, inclusive, provided that any company's or individual's diversion does not exceed the value of their respective diversion right or rights as above defined in this paragraph measured in total acre feet at any time between April 16 and October 10, inclusive, and provided further that the said companies and individuals may collectively overdraft the amount of water collectively available as stated in this paragraph at the time of the overdraft, but not exceeding in the aggregate 1,000 acre feet at such time, and provided further that all overdrafts shall be paid back from their portion of the yield of the river for satisfying the rights of the companies and parties as above set out in this paragraph on or before October 10 of the year in which said overdraft occurs.

There shall be no drafting on call of any water yielded by said river for satisfying the rights in this paragraph prior to April 16 or after October 10 in each and every year, but the companies and/or individuals owning said right or rights shall have

the privilege of using the water yielded by said river for satisfying said right or rights by direct diversion from March 1 to April 15, inclusive, and from October 11 to October 15, inclusive, in each and every year. The right of the said Exchange Users to the use of the water as set forth in this paragraph is not additional to their other rights herein set forth but is a part thereof and this paragraph shall be construed as further defining said right.

Fall Water

The West View Irrigation Company shall be entitled to 30 second feet of water from October 16 to November 15, inclusive, in each and every year, providing the same is available at its headgate from the yield of the river below Vermillion Dam.

The Gunnison Fayette Canal Company shall be entitled to 30 second feet of water from October 16 to November 15, inclusive, in each and every year, providing the same is available at its headgate from the yield of the river below Vermillion Dam.

The Dover Irrigation Company shall be entitled to 30 second feet of water from October 16 to November 15, inclusive, in each and every year, providing the same is available at its headgate from the yield of the river below Vermillion Dam.

All rights designated as "Fall Water" allocated to West View Irrigation Company, Gunnison Fayette Canal Company and Dover Irrigation Company shall be strictly appurtenant to the lands under their said canals respectively as now constructed and any and all rights, if any, to transfer the use of said water to other lands is hereby waived.

From November 16 to March 1 following, any water diverted into the West View, Gunnison Fayette and Dover Canals shall be for no other purpose than for culinary or stock watering use and the size of the stream shall be consistent with culinary and stock-watering needs and the water shall be diverted under the supervision of the Sevier River water commissioner and shall be returned to the river, without diminution except for necessary domestic and culinary use, by the most practical route.

In lieu of all the water rights of the Wellington Irrigation Company as above set forth and defined and finally allocated by this decree, it shall have the right annually to draw on call from the Sevier Bridge Reservoir in any quantity between April 15 and October 1, not exceeding the present capacity of its canal, being 25 second feet, 4,000 acre feet per annum to be used on the lands under its canal system.

The Leamington Irrigation Company and the Samuel McIntyre Investment Company shall have the right to the use of the water allocated to them respectively as above set forth, to be used by direct diversion from March 1 to April 15, both dates in-

clusive. From April 16 to October 1 in each and every year each of said companies shall have the right to store and impound in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir 90% of all the water yielded by said river for satisfying their respective rights from April 16 to October 1 and shall have the right jointly or severally to draw any or all water so stored until such time as the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall close the Irrigation season under the terms of a certain contract commonly called the "Four-Party Contract".

For drafting and/or storage privileges granted to the primary users in the lower zone as herein set forth, the following percentages of the following rights shall be irrevocably decreed to the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir to be stored in Sevier Bridge Reservoir or used by direct diversion for the periods of time in each and every year as set forth hereunder and as follows, to-wit:

The right of the Wellington Irrigation Company to the use of water as herein set forth shall be irrevocably decreed to the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir subject to the limitations herein stated.

Reservoir owners as herein set forth for storage privileges shall be as follows:

Central Utah Water Company shall be the sole owner of the right to the use of the first 3,000 acre feet of the waters accruing to the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir yielded by the river for satisfying the rights of the companies having storage privileges in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir as above set forth, excepting the right of Samuel McIntyre Investment Company, in seasons when the total water available for Sevier Bridge Reservoir and Piute Reservoir under the terms of this decree shall be 129,280 acre feet or less by July 1. All excess over said 3,000 acre feet which is to be allocated to said Central Utah Water Company from the sources above stated in this paragraph plus 10 per cent of the right of the Samuel McIntyre Investment Company which is to be irrevocably decreed to the owners of said Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall under all conditions be allocated as follows, to-wit:

The water yielded by said rights in seasons when the total water available for Sevier Bridge Reservoir and Piute Reservoir under the terms of this decree shall be more than 129,280 acre feet by July 1, shall be allocated to the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir as follows:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the owners of the Sevier Bridge Reservoir will hold in reserve in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir until October 10 in each and every year all water derived by them from the Samuel McIntyre Investment Company to be used towards providing for the overdraft of 1,000 acre feet on the river allowed to Exchange Users in the lower zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Deseret Irrigation Company, Central Utah Water Company and Abraham Irrigation Company shall each hold in reserve in the said Sevier Bridge Reservoir until October 10 of each and every year out of any water owned by them, 200 acre feet of water to be used towards the satisfaction of the said overdraft on the river of 1,000 acre feet last above mentioned.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that in the event the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir will not hold all or any portion of the Deseret Irrigation Company's Class D right, that is, 5714.4 acre feet between April 1 and July 1 in any year that said Class D right is available, then and in that event

The division as between the owners of Sevier Bridge Reservoir of the waters to be irrevocably decreed to said Sevier Bridge the Deseret Irrigation Company shall have the right to hold such excess in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir as an equalizer to the extent of the Deseret Company's ownership of capacity in said Sevier Bridge Reservoir not otherwise used at such time, and provided further that as soon as storage space in said Gunnison Bend Reservoir is available, the waters so detained in said Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall be withdrawn from said Sevier Bridge Reservoir and restored in said Gunnison Bend Reservoir.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that in the event the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir will not hold all or any portion of the Abraham Irrigation Company's Class D right, that is, 4285.6 acre feet between April 1 and July 1 in any year that said Class D right is available, then and in that event the Abraham Irrigation Company shall have the right to hold such excess in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir as an equalizer to the extent of the Abraham Company's ownership of capacity in said Sevier Bridge Reservoir not otherwise used at such time, and provided further that as soon as storage space in said Gunnison Bend Reservoir is available, the water so detained in said Sevier Bridge Reservoir shall be withdrawn from said Sevier Bridge Reservoir and re-stored in said Gunnison Bend Reservoir.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all losses on stored primary water in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir from seepage, evaporation, or any other cause or causes, shall be charged to and borne by the party or parties storing the same. This provision shall apply only as between Sevier Bridge Reservoir and persons or companies storing primary water therein. The several corporations and/or individuals listed as having storage privileges in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, that is, exchange users, and including the Leamington Irrigation Company and the Samuel McIntyre Investment Company, shall be exempt from charges or deductions for losses from any cause on water stored in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Sevier River water commissioner shall file within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month between March and November inclusive, of each and every year, either in his own office or in the office of the State Engineer each individual's or corporation's record of diversion of water from the Sevier River and/or reservoir or reservoirs, for the previous month, together with the amount of water due each Company or individual as of the last day of said previous calendar month.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that for the purpose of ascertaining from time to time the losses and gains in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir that the Sevier River water commissioner shall maintain a stream gauging station on the Sevier River and keep a record of discharge of the river at such gauging station, which shall be as near the back water of

the Sevier Bridge Reservoir as is practicable.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that temporarily and until finally determined, the allowance of water to be credited to the primary water between the Gunnison gauging station on Sevier River and the Juab gauging station on Sevier River, shall be 20 cubic feet per second between March 1 and October 1.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that August C. Sievers and Fremont D. Graue, successors in interest to Fred A. Rathje and A. D. Graue, are entitled annually to the use of 1,000 acre feet of the waters flowing from that certain spring known as the Lower Molen Spring (sometimes referred to as the Blue Spring), said waters to be diverted from said spring into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 250 acres of land situated in sections 10, 15, 22 and 27, Township 16 South, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, to be used between March 15 and October 15 in each and every year, and also the owner of the right to use .75 cubic feet of water per second of time from said spring for stock watering purposes from October 15 to March 15 of each year. The water herein decreed to said August C. Sievers and Fremont D. Graue shall be measured in the diversion canal from said spring at a point one-fourth mile northerly from said spring. All other water yielded by said spring shall be turned into the Sevier River for use by the parties entitled to the same.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Levan Irrigation Company is entitled to the use of a maximum of 40.80 c.f.s. and a minimum of 17.84 c.f.s. of the waters of Pigeon Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with date of priority as of 1865; said water shall be diverted from Pigeon Creek at a point in the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 28, Township 14 South, Range 1 East, into an unnamed canal and used to irrigate 1426.5 acres of land under its canal system; and shall further be entitled to the use of a maximum of 42.88 c.f.s. and a minimum of 18.75 c.f.s. of the waters of Chicken Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1865, to be diverted from Chicken Creek at a point near the center of Section 33, Township 14 South, Range 1 East, into an unnamed canal and used to irrigate 1500.1 acres of land under its canal system.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Metal Grip Plaster Company is entitled to the use of 6.25 c.f.s. from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year of the waters of Chicken Creek for power purposes only, to be diverted from said Chicken Creek at a point 4061 feet East and 950 feet South of the East quarter corner of Section 33, Township 14 South, Range 1 East, into an unnamed ditch and pipe line aggregating 7030 feet in length, and used for generating power for use at Levan, Utah, with a priority date of May 8, 1906; and after having been so used, the water is to be returned to the natural channel at a point which bears South 10 degrees 08 minutes East

555 feet from the Center of said Section 33.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Levan City shall be entitled to 350 gallons of water per minute of time from January 1 to December 31, inclusive, in each and every year, for domestic and municipal purposes, said water to be diverted from springs in the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 33, Township 14 South, Range 1 East, into a pipe line, with priority date as of 1865.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that H. R. Francom is entitled to .07 c.f.s. of the waters of Skinner Springs from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, said water to be diverted from Skinner Springs (Spring Canyon and Rock Canyon Springs) at a point in the Northwest quarter of Section 5, Township 15 South, Range 1 East, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 3.5 acres of land located in said section 5, with priority date as of 1900; and is further entitled to the use of .07 c.f.s. from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year of the waters of said Skinner Springs, to be diverted at the point last above described and used for domestic and stock watering purposes, with priority date as of 1900.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that E. W. Peterson, W. M. Mangleson, M. Christensen, and R. Mangleson are entitled to the use of a maximum of 5.17 c.f.s. and a minimum of 2.22 c.f.s. of the waters from Deep Canyon Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1880, to be diverted from Deep Canyon Creek at a point in Section 18, Township 18 South, Range 1 East, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 180.8 acres of land located in Section 7, Township 15 South, Range 1 East, and in Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, and that as between themselves the said water is to be divided equally to each claimant; and said persons are further entitled to the use of 1 c.f.s. from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year for stock watering purposes, the said water to be diverted at the same point as last above described, with priority date as of 1880.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Thad A. Powell is entitled to the use of .47 c.f.s. from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year of the waters of a certain spring area, said waters to be diverted from the said spring area at a point Northeast of the Northwest corner of Section 11, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 32.6 acres of land embraced in said Section 11, with a priority date as of 1900; and is further entitled to the use of .10 c.f.s. from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year of the waters of said spring area, to be diverted at the point last above described, to be used for stock watering purposes, with priority date as of 1900.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Eugene Powell is entitled to the use of 2.50 c.f.s. from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year of the waters of a certain

spring area, said waters to be diverted from said spring area at a point Southeast of the Northwest corner of Section 10, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 125.2 acres of land embraced in the aforesaid Section 10, with priority date as of 1900; and is further entitled to the use of .10 c.f.s. of the waters of said spring area from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year, said waters to be diverted from the said spring area at the point last above described and used for stock watering purposes for 100 head of horses and cattle, with priority date as of 1900.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that L. L. St. John, Mary Ellen Schofield and James Metcalf, Jr. are entitled to the use of 45.50 c.f.s. of the waters of Little Salt Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year for the irrigation of 1,589 acres of land under their canal system, also 2 c.f.s. from Oct. 1st to April 1st for stock watering purposes, with priority date as of 1872, said water to be diverted from Little Salt Creek at a point 1850 feet North and 400 feet East of the Southeast corner of Section 35, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate said land which is located in Sections 25, 26, 35, 23, 24, 34, 33 and 22, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, said waters to be pro rated to said parties as follows: L. L. St. John, 2/3 interest; Mary Ellen Schofield, 1/6 interest; James Metcalf, Jr., 1/6 interest; with priority date as of 1887.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that A. Z. Bonhan is entitled to the use of .022 c.f.s. of the waters of Skinner's or Mud Springs from January 1 to December 31, inclusive, in each and every year, with date of priority as of June 9, 1911, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 984; said water to be diverted from said Skinner's or Mud Springs at two points (1) North 61 degrees 0 minutes West 1442.1 feet (2) North 66 degrees 56 minutes West 2234.6 feet from the South quarter corner of Section 14, Township 16 South, Range 1 West, into a pipe line, and to be used for domestic purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Solomon D. Chase, James Chase and Mary Etta Chase are entitled to the use of 31.70 c.f.s. of the waters of Chriss Canyon from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with a priority date as of 1885; said water to be diverted from said Chriss Canyon at a point on the East line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 3, Township 16 South, Range 1 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 1107.1 acres of land described as follows: Solomon D. Chase -- 152.5 acres in Section 33, Township 15 South, Range 1 West; 126.6 acres in Section 3, Township 16 South, Range 1 West; 282.4 acres in Section 4, Township 16 South, Range 1 West. James Chase -- 87.7 acres in Section 3, Township 16 South, Range 1 West; 205.4 acres in Section 4, Township 16 South, Range 1 West; 83 acres in Section 9,

Township 16 South, Range 1 West; 129.5 acres in Section 10, Township 16 South, Range 1 West. Mary Etta Chase -- 40 acres in Section 9, Township 16 South, Range 1 West. Said water to be pro rated to the owners of the use thereof for periods of time in proportion as their respective acreage bears to the whole acreage. Also 1.5 c.f.s. of the waters of said Chriss Canyon from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year, with priority date as of 1885, said water to be used for stock watering purposes and to be diverted at the point last above described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Juab Lake Irrigation Company, Inc., is entitled to the use of 2400 acre feet of water from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1900, said water to be diverted from Chicken Creek at a point 1700 feet West and 1410 feet North of the Southeast corner of Section 19, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, into ditches Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 and used to irrigate 829.6 acres of land described as follows: 78.6 acres in Sec. 19, Township 15 South, Range 1 West; 10.3 acres in Section 24, 181.5 acres in Section 26, 7.0 acres in Section 23, Township 15 South, Range 1½ West; 317.4 acres in Section 25, 155.8 acres in Section 36, 26.3 acres in Section 35, Township 15 South, Range 2 West; 52.7 acres in Section 1, Township 16 South, Range 2 West. Also the right to store 2000 acre feet of water from the waters of Chicken Creek from October 15 to June 15 next succeeding in each and every year, with period of use from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1900, said water to be stored in the Juab Reservoir located in Sections 16, 17, 19 and 20, Township 15 South, Range 1 West, said water to be released and used as a supplemental supply to irrigate the lands last above described. Also the use of water from said Chicken Creek for domestic, stock watering and municipal purposes from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year, with priority date as of 1900, said water to be diverted at the point and through the ditches hereinbefore described and used for domestic, stock watering and municipal purposes at the Town of Mills. The quantity of water to be used shall be only such an amount as is necessary to supply the domestic, stock watering and municipal purposes of the residents of the said town of Mills, and is to be distributed under the supervision of the Sevier River Water Commissioner.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Juab Development Company is entitled to the use of 5 c.f.s. of the waters of Chase and Foote Springs from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1891, said waters to be diverted from the Chase and Foote Springs at a point in the East half of the Northeast quarter of Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 2 West, into an unnamed canal and used to irrigate 400 acres of land described as follows: 80 acres in Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 2 West, and 320 acres in Section 35, Township 15 South, Range 2 West, said water to be

always appurtenant to said lands. Also 1 c.f.s. from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year, with priority date as of 1891, said water to be diverted from the point and into the canals described in the next preceeding paragraph, and used for domestic purposes of 50 persons for municipal purposes in the town of Mills, and for stock watering purposes of 3000 head of horses and cattle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Scipio Irrigation Company, Inc., is entitled to the use of a maximum of 1.83 c.f.s. and a minimum of 1.37 c.f.s. of the waters of Round Valley Creek from April 1 to October 15, with priority date as of 1860. Said water to be diverted from Round Valley Creek at a point 1250 feet South and 1035 feet East of the Southwest corner of Section 4, Township 19 South, Range 2 West, into ditch No. 1 and used to irrigate 109.4 acres of land as follows: 17.8 acres in Section 4 and 91.6 acres in Section 5, Township 19 South, Range 2 West. And is further entitled to a maximum of 80.60 c.f.s. and a minimum of 60.45 c.f.s. of the waters of said Round Valley Creek from April 1 to October 15, in each and every year, with a priority date as of 1860. Said water to be diverted from Round Valley Creek at a point 1975 feet West and 10 feet South of the Southeast corner of Section 32, Township 18 South, Range 2 West, into the East and West Canal and used to irrigate 4836.3 acres of land described as follows: 344.6 acres in Section 32, 433.5 acres in Section 29, 4.9 acres in Section 28, 348.3 acres in Section 30, 617.6 acres in Section 19, 359.4 acres in Section 20, 234.2 acres in Section 17, 543.5 acres in Section 18, 481.7 acres in Section 7, 302.1 acres in Section 8, 382.4 acres in Section 5, 41.5 acres in Section 6, Township 18 South, Range 2 West; 29.7 acres in Section 25, 264.9 acres in Section 24, 277.5 acres in Section 13, 93.7 acres in Section 12, Township 18 South, Range 3 West; 76.8 acres in Section 32, Township 17 South, Range 2 West. And is further entitled to the use of .66 c.f.s. of the water of a certain spring from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1860. Said water to be diverted from a spring in the Northwest quarter of Section 16, Township 19 South, Range 2 West, into a pipe line and used for domestic and municipal purposes at the town of Scipio. And is further entitled to 6586 acre feet of the waters of said Round Valley Creek, with period of storage from September 1 to July 1 next succeeding in each and every year, and with a period of use from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1860. Said water to be stored in the Scipio Lake Reservoir located in Sections 34, 35, Township 19 South, Range 2 West; Sections 3, 11, 10, 14, Township 20 South, Range 2 West. Said water to be used as a supplemental supply to irrigate the lands hereinbefore described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Jacob S. Bastian is entitled to the use of .00111 c.f.s. from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year of the waters

of Sweet Water Spring, with priority date as of December 10, 1917, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1256. Said water to be diverted from the Sweetwater Spring at a point South 42 degrees 07 minutes West 3236 feet from the East quarter corner of Section 10, Township 19 South, Range 1½ West into a pipe line and troughs and used for domestic purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Ervin M. Brown is entitled to the use of .0088 c.f.s. of the waters of an unnamed spring from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of April 27, 1920, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1242. Said water to be diverted from an unnamed spring at a point 1626 feet West and 396 feet North of the Northwest corner of Section 14, Township 18 South, Range 3 West, into a pipe line 1700 feet long and used for stock watering purposes of 125 head of horses and cattle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Frank S. Hatch is entitled to the use of .81 c.f.s. of the waters of Oak Creek Canyon Spring from April 1 to October 1 in each and every year, with priority date as of September 20, 1915, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1101. Said water to be diverted from the Oak Creek Canyon Spring at a point 252 feet South and 1150 feet West of the Northwest corner of Section 10, Township 17 South, Range 3 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 20 acres of land embraced in Section 7, Township 17 South, Range 2 West. And is further entitled to the use of 3 c.f.s. of the waters of Syphon Springs from March 1 to October 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of May 22, 1916, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1014. Said water to be diverted from the Syphon Springs at a point North 79 degrees 12 minutes West 10629 feet from the Northwest corner of Section 7, Township 17 South, Range 2 West, and used to irrigate 160 acres of land in the Northwest quarter of said Section 7.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Hans Hassell is entitled to the use of .57 c.f.s. of the waters of certain springs from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1880. Said water to be diverted from springs described as follows: 6 springs in the South half of Section 14; a spring 2120 feet South and 160 feet East of the Northwest corner of Section 24; a spring 1540 feet South and 65 feet East of the North quarter corner of Section 23; a spring 1320 feet South and 1870 feet West of the Northeast corner of Section 23, all in Township 11 South, Range 5 West, stored in 5 small reservoirs and used to irrigate 40 acres of land in Section 23 in the aforesaid township and range. And shall further be entitled to the said quantity of water from October 15 to April 1 of each and every year for domestic and stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the McIntyre Investment Company is entitled to the use of .64 c.f.s. of the waters of Cherry Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year. Said water to be diverted from Cherry Creek at a point in the Northwest quarter of Section 10, Township 12 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 44.5 acres of land described as follows: 32.4 acres in Section 10 and 12.1 acres in Section 15, all in the aforesaid township and range. And is further entitled to the use of .43 c.f.s. of the waters of an unnamed spring from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year. Said water to be diverted from a spring at a point approximately in Section 10, Township 12 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 30.4 acres of land in Section 30 of the aforesaid township and range. And is further entitled to the use of .43 c.f.s. of the waters of Devil Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year. Said water to be diverted from Devil Creek into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 30.3 acres of land embraced in Section 28, Township 11 South, Range 3 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Peter Mayer is entitled to the use of 147.92 acre feet of the waters of Tanner Creek, with priority date as of October 15, 1906, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 52-B. Said water to be diverted from Tanner Creek at a point North 3 degrees 50 minutes West 1865.5 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 29, Township 13 South, Range 4 West, conveyed by means of an earth canal a distance of 2077 feet to a reservoir situated in the Northeast quarter of Section 32, Township 13 South, Range 4 West. The capacity of the reservoir is 73.96 acre feet with rights to fill twice yearly. The water is used from January 1 to December 31 for stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Fool Creek Irrigation Company, Inc., is entitled to the use of 14.84 c.f.s. of the waters of Fool Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1872. Said water to be diverted from Fool Creek at a point approximately in Section 18, Township 16 South, Range 3 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 1038.6 acres of land described as follows: 168.4 acres in Section 35, 320.5 acres in Section 34, 286.1 acres in Section 27, and 263.6 acres in Section 26, all in Township 15 South, Range 4 West. And is further entitled to the use of 1 c.f.s. from October 15 to April 1 next succeeding in each and every year with priority date as of 1872. Said water to be diverted at a point last above described and used for stock watering purposes of 800 head of horses and cattle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Leamington and Fool Creek Pipe Line Company is entitled to the use of .50 c.f.s. of the waters of said Fool Creek from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority

date as of 1872. Said water to be diverted from Fool Creek at a point approximately in Section 18, Township 16 South, Range 3 West, into a pipe and pressure tank from which it is distributed for municipal purposes of 300 persons at the town of Leamington and for stock watering purposes of 500 head of domestic stock.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that John L. Neilson, Edgar Neilson, and Wallace Neilson, are entitled to the use of .25 c.f.s. of the waters of Pole Canyon Springs from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1890. Said water to be diverted from Pole Canyon Springs at a point near the Northeast corner of the Northeast quarter of Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 12.5 acres of land described as follows: 4.3 acres in Section 35, Township 15 South, Range 4 West, and 8.2 acres in Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That the Oak City Pipe Water Company is entitled to the use of .038 c.f.s. of the waters of springs in Dry Creek from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of January 13, 1911, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 303. Said water to be diverted from a group of springs in Dry Creek at a point 5395 feet South and 895 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 9, Township 17 South, Range 4 West, into a pipe line and used for domestic purposes of 450 persons and for municipal purposes at Oak City. The water is also used as a supplementary supply to irrigate 640.0 acres of land in the South half of Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 4 West, and the North half of Section 6, Township 17 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Simon Stephenson and James J. Stephenson are entitled to the use of 2.71 c.f.s. of the waters of Giles, Whiskey and Duggins Creeks from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1876. Said water to be diverted at each, either or all of the following described points: (1) from Giles Creek at a point 11260 feet North and 257 feet East of the Northeast corner of Section 16, Township 18 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch; (2) from Whiskey Creek at a point 6190 feet North and 262 feet West of the Northeast corner of said Section 16 into an unnamed ditch; (3) from Duggins Creek at a point 1310 feet West and 835 feet South of the above described corner into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 135.4 acres of land owned and described as follows:

Said water to be diverted as follows: 2.00 c.f.s. from Giles Creek at a point North 11260 feet and East 257 feet from the Northeast corner of Section 16, Township 18 South, Range 4 West; .50 c.f.s. from Whiskey Creek at a point North 6190 feet and West 262 feet from said corner; .50 c.f.s. from Duggins Creek at a point 1310 feet West and 835 feet South of the above described corner. Said water to be diverted from Hunter Spring at a point 425 feet East and 1250 feet South of the Northwest corner of Section 12, Township 20 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irri-

gate 4.8 acres of land described as follows: 1.4 acres in Section 11, and 3.4 acres in Section 12, Township 20 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that whenever the volume of water flowing in Chalk Creek in Millard County, Utah, is $24\frac{1}{2}$ cu. feet per second of time or less then Fillmore City is entitled to the use of $14\frac{1}{2}/25$ of the same and The Fillmore Irrigation Co. is entitled to the use of the other $10\frac{1}{2}/25$ of the same during the entire period of time in each and every year, and Fillmore City is to deliver to The Fillmore Irrigation Co. said $10\frac{1}{2}/25$ of the same to which The Fillmore Irrigation Co. is entitled at a point on the channel of Chalk Creek known as the measuring gate located below what is known as the old creamery and above the point on the channel of said Chalk Creek where the waters are divided which run to the Sink from the waters which flow to the old field and the reservoir, and each party is to pay one-half of the expense of installing and maintaining suitable measuring devices, and all of the water flowing in said Chalk Creek in excess of $24\frac{1}{2}$ cu. feet per second of time as against Fillmore City, and the use of the same is decreed to The Fillmore Irrigation Company, subject however, to the rights of the other parties to this suit as hereinafter set forth.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that whenever the volume of water flowing in said Chalk Creek is 100 cu. feet per second or more, then George C. Veile is entitled to use and divert $21.47/5000$ of the waters of said Chalk Creek in excess of 100 cu. feet per second of time, during the same period of time in each and every week, that he uses the $6\frac{1}{2}$ city lots of water distributed to him by Fillmore City. The Fillmore Irrigation Co. is to pay one-half the expense and George C. Veile is to pay the other half of the expense of dividing and distributing said quantity of water to George C. Veile.

That whenever the volume of water flowing in said Chalk Creek is 100 cu. feet per second of time or more then John A. Peterson is entitled to divert and use $7/5000$ of the waters of said Chalk Creek in excess of 100 cu. feet per second of time during such period of time in each and every week as he uses four city lots of water distributed to him by Fillmore City, the Fillmore Irrigation Co. is to pay one-half the expense and John A. Peterson is to pay the other one-half of the expense of dividing and distributing to John A. Peterson said quantity of water.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Will Jackson and Emma Nichols are entitled to the use of a sufficient quantity of water from Dry Creek, a tributary of Chalk Creek, to irrigate two acres of land from the first day of April in each and every year down to such time in each and every year as the waters of said Dry Creek cease to flow down and commingle with the waters of a certain spring rising in the bed of said Dry Creek, and at such time as the waters of said Dry Creek shall cease to flow down and commingle with the said stream Will Jackson and Emma Nichols are entitled to the use of all the waters of

said Dry Creek up to the first day of November in each and every year for the irrigation of the said two acres of land, the Fillmore Irrigation Co. is to pay the one-half of the expense and Will Jackson and Emma Nichols are to pay the other one-half of the expense of dividing and distributing said quantity of water.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That all of the rest of the waters flowing in said Chalk Creek not herein decreed to other parties to this suit, and the use of the same is owned by the Fillmore Irrigation Co. and the Fillmore Irrigation Co. has the exclusive right to divert and use and distribute to its stockholders all of the waters flowing in said Chalk Creek at all seasons and times during each and every year not decreed to any other parties to this suit.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Edwin Bartholomew and the administrator of his estate, William Hatton, Antone Sorenson, Ova Peterson, Lars Rasmussen, Rasmus Rasmussen, and Christian Anderson are not entitled to the use of any of the waters of said Chalk Creek except such water, if any, as they may be entitled to use by virtue of the fact that they own certain city water distributed to them by Fillmore City, or water stock in the Fillmore Irrigation Co. and which the Fillmore Irrigation Co. distributes to them and as to them the Fillmore Irrigation Co. is entitled to the use of the waters of said Chalk Creek decreed to it and which is hereby by this decree quieted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That this court shall retain jurisdiction of this action and of the parties to the same and their successors in interest for the purpose of regulating, controlling and distributing the waters of said Chalk Creek, and use of the same to the parties hereto and to their successors in interest and that either party to this action may upon application to this court by motion and after ten days' notice to the other parties to this suit, or to their successors in interest, or to their attorney, have a commissioner appointed by this court to divide, distribute and regulate the use of the water herein decreed to the parties entitled to the same, the expense to be born and paid for as herein provided.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That the rights herein decreed are founded upon appropriation of water for beneficial uses, and the title of the parties hereto and their right to the use of the said water herein decreed is hereby quieted as against each and every other party to this action, and each and every other party hereto, their successors and assigns, and their agents, servants, employees, are hereby forever enjoined from in any manner or at all interfering one with the other in the full, free and unrestricted use of the quantity of water decreed to them or interfering with such distribution of said water, if any, as may be made by any commissioner appointed by this court to distribute the same.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED

That this court shall have jurisdiction to make all necessary supplemental orders which may be required to make effectual the rights herein decreed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Almon Robison estate and successors in interest to the same, are entitled to the use of 29 c.f.s. of the waters of Pine Creek, with priority date as of 1855. Said water to be diverted from Pine Creek at a point approximately in Section 28, Township 22 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used as a supplemental supply to Chalk Creek rights to irrigate 2319.1 acres of land described as follows: 51.0 acres in Section 27, 31.5 acres in Section 26, 169.9 acres in Section 33, 538.3 acres in Section 34, 613.4 acres in Section 35, Township 21 South, Range 5 West; 505.4 acres in Section 4, 53.1 acres in Section 5, 355.1 acres in Section 3, 1.4 acres in Section 10, Township 22 South, Range 5 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the estate of Almon D. Robison, and his successors in interest to the same, are entitled to 1.25 c.f.s. of the waters of said Pine Creek from July 15 to October 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of December 14, 1909, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1069. Said water to be diverted from Pine Creek at a point 780 feet West and 756 feet North of the South quarter corner of Section 10, Township 22 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 21.4 acres of land embraced in Section 29, Township 21 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Harrison Anderson is entitled to the use of .60 c.f.s. of the waters of Maple Hollow, with priority date as of 1860. Said water to be diverted from Maple Hollow at a point North 62 degrees 52 minutes West 2412 feet from the East quarter corner of Section 10, Township 22 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 37.8 acres of land embraced in Section 29, Township 21 South, Range 4 West. Also a right to the use of .20 c.f.s. of the waters of said Maple Hollow during the non-irrigation season, with priority date as of 1860, for stock watering purposes. Said water to be diverted as above described and used for stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Nolan F. Robison is entitled to the use of .60 c.f.s. of the waters of Maple Hollow, with priority date as of 1860. Said water to be diverted from Maple Hollow at a point North 62 degrees 52 minutes West 2412 feet from the East quarter corner of Section 10, Township 22 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 40.9 acres of land embraced in Section 29, Township 21 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Frank Warner is entitled to the use of .397 c.f.s. of the water of Triangle Canyon Creek from March 1 to June 30, with priority

date as of April 28, 1910, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 216. Said water to be diverted from Triangle Canyon Creek at a point South 38 degrees 30 minutes East 6400 feet from the Northwest corner of Section 9, Township 22 South, Range 4 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 3.4 acres of land located in Section 8, Township 22 South, Range 4 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That Ray Stott is entitled to the use of 1 c.f.s. of water from an unnamed spring from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of October 7, 1919, under his application filed in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 8321. Said water to be diverted from unnamed springs at a point North 89 degrees 40 minutes East 3254 feet from the West quarter corner of Section 24, Township 22 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and to be used to irrigate 80 acres of land in the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 23, and the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 24, Township 22 South, Range 5 West. As much of said water as is necessary will also be used from January 1 to December 31 for domestic purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Meadow Irrigation Company, Inc., is the owner of a right to the use of 50.41 c.f.s. of the waters of Meadow Creek and Walker Canyon, with priority date as of 1850. Said water to be diverted from Meadow Creek and Walker Canyon at a point 720 feet West and 1695 feet South of the Northeast corner of Section 14, Township 22 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 2520.7 acres of land described as follows: 27.9 acres in Section 10, 160.3 acres in Section 15, 224.9 acres in Section 16, 155.7 acres in Section 17, 137.6 acres in Section 20, 605.5 acres in Section 21, 512.9 acres in Section 22, 100.6 acres in Section 23, 211.6 acres in Section 27, 286.2 acres in Section 28, 61.5 acres in Section 29, all in Township 22 South, Range 5 West. Also a domestic, municipal and stock watering right from said Meadow Creek and Walker Canyon during the non-irrigation season, with priority date as of 1850, sufficient for the municipal purposes of the town of Meadow for 500 persons and 400 head of horses and cattle. Also a supplemental right to one-half of the waters of Dry Creek, but not exceeding 6 c.f.s., with priority date as of 1850. Said water to be diverted from Dry Creek at a point in Section 26, Township 22 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used as a supplemental supply to irrigate the lands above described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That the waters of Dry Creek in Millard County, Utah, be and the same are hereby decreed and distributed as follows:

(a) That MEADOW IRRIGATION COMPANY be entitled to the use of One-half of the waters of the said Dry Creek to be diverted from said Dry Creek at a point in Section 26, Township

22 South, Range 5 West, S. L. M.,

(b) That the other one-half of the said Dry Creek be divided as follows between the respective parties, entitled to the use of its waters;

That when the waters of said creek, including the waters belonging to Meadow Irrigation Company are divided on regular eight (8) day turns, then and in that event --

Meadow Irrigation Company shall be entitled to all of said waters for a period of Ninety-six (96) hours or one-half of said stream as set forth in paragraph (a) herein above, and --

From the said regular 8 day turn above mentioned,

CLAUDE HUFF shall be entitled to the use of said stream for a period of twenty-eight (28) hours and seven and one-half (7½) minutes, and,

CHARLES SWALLOW shall be entitled to the use of said stream for a period of twenty (20) hours, and.

MACK PENNEY shall be entitled to the use of said stream for a period of twenty-eight (28) hours and seven and one-half (7½) minutes, and,

The Estate of OSCAR ANDERSON, deceased, shall be entitled to the use of said stream for a period of One (1) hour, and,

LEFFEL FISHER shall be entitled to the use of said stream for a period of Eighteen (18) hours and Forty-five (45) minutes.

(c) That when said stream is divided for practical reasons on other than the aforesaid 8 day turns, the respective owners of water thereunder shall be entitled to their similar respective proportions thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Edward B. Bushnell and his successors in interest are entitled to the use of .011 c.f.s. of the waters of Spring Seep from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of February 2, 1916, under certificate of appropriation issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 1038, for stock watering purposes. Said water to be diverted from Spring Seep at a point North 48 degrees 30 minutes West 9816 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 36, Township 21 South, Range 7 West, into a 2½ inch pipe line and used for stock watering purposes of 4100 head of sheep and 250 head of horses and cattle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Corn Creek Irrigation Company, Inc., is entitled to the use of 89 c.f.s. of the waters of Corn Creek, with priority date as of 1880. Said water to be diverted from Corn Creek at each, either or both of the following described points: (1) 1580 feet West and 1370 feet South of the Northeast corner of Section 28, Township 22 South, Range 5 West, into the E. & W. Field Ditch; (2) 600 feet West and 1430 feet South of said corner into the Indian Ditch and used to irrigate 3550.9 acres of land described as follows: 134.1 acres in Section 5, 463.5 acres in Section 6, 153.7 acres in Section 7, 268.5 acres in Section 8, 151.1 acres in Section 10, 376.6 acres in Section 17, 413.8 acres in Section 18, 281.4

acres in Section 19, 512.3 acres in Section 20, 127.4 acres in Section 21, 22.9 acres in Section 21, 67.3 acres in Section 28, 153.6 acres in Section 29, 11.8 acres in Section 30, Township 23 South, Range 5 West; 85.0 acres in Section 12, 88.9 acres in Section 13, Township 23 South, Range 6 West; 71.1 acres in Section 31, 162.1 acres in Section 32, Township 22 South, Range 5 West; 5.8 acres in Section 36, Township 22 South, Range 6 West. And also entitled to the use of 6 c.f.s. during the non-irrigation season, with priority date as of 1880, for stock watering and municipal purposes. Said water to be diverted as above described and used for domestic purposes of 700 persons, for stock watering purposes of 1200 head of horses and cattle, and for municipal purposes at the town of Kanosh.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Frank J. Christensen, Frank Paxton, Charles Bird, Parley Kimball, Charles Christensen, Earnest Bushnell, P. Pearson, and William Anderson, and their successors in interest, are entitled to the use of 17.20 c.f.s. of the waters from Big Cottonwood Creek, with priority date as of 1880. Said water to be diverted from Big Cottonwood Creek and used to irrigate 697.0 acres of land embraced in Sections 32 and 33, Township 22 South, Range 5 West, and Sections 4 and 5, Township 23 South, Range 5 West. Said water to be prorated as follows:

Said water to be diverted from Cottonwood Creek at two points as follows: (1) 1047 feet North and 4682 feet East of the Southeast corner of

Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 5 West; (2) 1469 feet North and 816 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into unnamed ditches and used to irrigate the land above described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that William Penny, E. H. Mortensen, and Dennis B. Manhard are entitled to the use of 4 c.f.s. of the waters of Little Cottonwood Creek, with priority date as of 1890. Also a supplemental right from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year of the waters of Oak Spring, with priority date as of 1890. Said water to be diverted from Oak Spring at a point in the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 12, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used as a supplemental supply to irrigate the 20.0 acres of land above described. Also a right to the use of .50 c.f.s. during the non-irrigation season, with priority date as of 1890, for stock watering purposes. cribed in said application, subject, however, to final proof being submitted and approved by the State Engineer of the State of Utah.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that William Holt and Isabelle Holt are the owners of .85 c.f.s. of the waters of Brush and Wine Hollow Creeks, with priority date as of 1894. Said water to be diverted from Brush and Wine Hollow Creeks at a point in Section 23, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 42.7 acres of land embraced in Section 15 in the aforesaid Township and Range.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Frank J. Christensen is the owner of .25 c.f.s. of the waters of Dewal Spring Basin from January 1 to December 31 of each and every year, with priority date as of April 13, 1914, under certificate of appropriation No. 433 issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah. Said water to be diverted from the Dewal Spring Basin at a point 850 feet North and 460 feet West from the South quarter corner of Section 32, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 15.0 acres of land embraced in the North half of the Northeast quarter of Section 31 in the aforesaid Township and Range.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Frank J. Christensen is entitled to the use 1.70 c.f.s. of the waters of Dewal Springs from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of February 21, 1914, under certificate of appropriation No. 445 issued by the State Engineer of the State of Utah. Said water to be diverted from the Dewal Spring at a point 600 feet South and 265 feet East of the South quarter corner of Section 32, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 2.0 acres of land embraced in the North half of the Northeast quarter of Section 31, Township 23 South, Range 5 West.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that C. D. Ahlstrom is entitled to the use of .06 c.f.s. of the waters of Spring Hollow, with priority date as of 1888, with period of use from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year. Said water to be diverted from Spring Hollow at a point approximately in Section 2, Township 24 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 3.0 acres of land embraced in said Section 2; and for stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that William Penny and his successors in interest, are entitled to the entire flow of three unnamed springs from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1897. Said water to be diverted from three unnamed springs in the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 25.0 acres of land embraced in the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of said Section 14; and for stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Pearl A. Black, Thomas Paxton, Roberts & Watts, and Hyrum Iverson, and their successors in interest, are entitled to the use of 6.70 c.f.s. of the waters of Dry Wash, with priority date as of 1900, with period of use from April 1 to October 15. Said water to be diverted from Dry Wash at each, either or both of the following described points: (1) 500 feet East and 600 feet South of the Northwest corner of Section 36, Township 23 South, Range 6 West, into an unnamed ditch; (2) 2400 feet North and 400 feet East of the Southwest corner of Section 25, Township 23 South, Range 6 West. Said water is used to irrigate 267.5 acres of land owned and described as follows:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the right of the West Hinckley Land & Water Company to the use of water applied for in its application No. 4060 in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah, with priority date as of November 6, 1911, is hereby decreed to the said West Hinckley Land & Water Company subject to it making final proof in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the right to the use of all the waters of the said Sevier River hereinafter set forth, are to be satisfied out of the waters arising in or yielded in that section of the Sevier River below the impounding dam of the Gunnison Bend Reservoir in Millard County, Utah; and the right to the use of all of the waters yielded in said section of the river below the impounding dam of the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir are hereby awarded, distributed and decreed as follows:

The first $6.66 \frac{2}{3}$ c.f.s. yielded by said river below said impounding dam from March 1 to November 1 in each and every year is hereby awarded and decreed as follows: To Noah Rogers, 2 c.f.s.; to Joseph Dewsnap, $1.33 \frac{1}{3}$ c.f.s.; and to Thomas Dear-don, William Conk, Amanda Conk, Henry Conk, and their succes-sors in interest, jointly, $3.33 \frac{1}{3}$ c.f.s. to be diverted from said River at what is commonly known as the Conk Dam. The said $6.66 \frac{2}{3}$ c.f.s. of the waters yielded by said Sevier River below the impounding dam of the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir is here-

by adjudged and decreed to be a first and prior and superior right to all other rights to the use of the waters yielded by said Sevier River below the said impounding dam of said Gunnison Bend Reservoir.

After the said first and prior right of said 6.66 $\frac{2}{3}$ c.f.s. has been satisfied in full, the next 8.84 second feet of water arising in said river below the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir during the entire year, that is, from January 1 to December 31, inclusive, of each and every year, is hereby awarded and decreed to Noah Rogers, Alice Rogers, Joseph B. Dewsnup, George W. Baker, Andrew Rogers, Emory Rogers, Nicholson Seed Farms Inc., Noah Rogers as administrator of the estate of John Rogers, deceased, and George F. Croft, and to their successors in interest, except as herein specifically provided.

There is hereby allocated and decreed to E. J. Eliason and James H. Mace, all of the waters arising in said river below the impounding dam of said Gunnison Bend Reservoir in excess of 15.5 second feet from March 1 to October 1 in each and every year until they have received a total of 70 acre feet of water.

There is further allocated and decreed to the said E. J. Eliason and James H. Mace, the use of all of the waters arising in the said Sevier River below the impounding dam of the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir, except 2 second feet of water for culinary and stock watering purposes from 10 o'clock A. M. of December 1 to 10 o'clock A. M. of December 8 in each and every year.

The said 2 second feet of water for culinary and stock watering purposes is hereby allocated and decreed to Noah Rogers, Alice Rogers, Joseph B. Dewsnup, Andrew Rogers, Emory Rogers, Nicholson Seed Farms Inc., Noah Rogers as administrator of the estate of John Rogers, deceased, and George F. Croft, and their successors in interest.

There is hereby decreed and allocated to C. O. Warnick and Peter T. Black, all of the waters arising in said river below the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir, except 2 second feet for culinary and stock watering purposes from 10 o'clock A. M. of January 1 until 10 o'clock A. M. of January 17 of each and every year. The said 2 second feet of water for culinary and stock watering purposes is awarded and decreed to the parties to whom the same was awarded and decreed in the next preceding paragraph.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all the waters arising in said river below the impounding dam of the Gunnison Bend Reservoir, and after the rights above enumerated have been satisfied, there is hereby allocated and decreed in each and every year to Noah Rogers, Alice Rogers, Joseph B. Dewsnup, George W. Baker, Andrew Rogers, Emory Rogers, Nicholson Seed Farms Inc., Noah Rogers as administrator of the estate of John Rogers, deceased, and George F. Croft, and their successors in interest, a sufficient amount of water which, when added to the water heretofore allocated and decreed to them, shall be sufficient to irrigate 1246 acres of land on the basis of 2 acre

feet of water per acre of land.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That after all of the above and prior rights to the water arising in the Sevier River below the Gunnison Bend Reservoir have been fully satisfied, any additional water arising therein is hereby allocated and decreed to C. O. Warnick and Peter T. Black until they have had a sufficient quantity of water which, when added to their right hereinbefore set forth, shall allow them a sufficient quantity of water to irrigate 250 acres of land on the basis of 2 acre feet of water per acre of land, provided that such water shall be applied and used from September 1 in each and every year to June 30 in each and every succeeding year.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that after all of the above enumerated rights are satisfied, then the remainder of the water of said Sevier River below the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir is hereby allocated and decreed during the whole of each and every year, to Noah Rogers, Alice Rogers, Joseph B. Dewsnup, George W. Baker, Andrew Rogers, Emory Rogers, Nicholson Seed Farms Inc., Noah Rogers as administrator of the estate of John Rogers, deceased, and George F. Croft, and their successors in interest.

That as between Noah Rogers, Alice Rogers, Joseph B. Dewsnup, George W. Baker, Andrew Rogers, Emory Rogers, Nicholson Seed Farms Inc., Noah Rogers as administrator of the estate of John Rogers, deceased, and George F. Croft, and their successors in interest, the waters herein decreed and allocated to them in excess of the said prior and superior right of 6.66 $\frac{2}{3}$ c.f.s. of said water which has been specifically distributed between the parties entitled to use the same shall be, and is hereby, awarded and decreed to said parties on the following percentage basis, to-wit:

The said Noah Rogers shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 18.42% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

That Joseph B. Dewsnup shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 9.31% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

That George W. Baker shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 10.86% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

That George F. Croft shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 10.86% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

Andrew and Emory Rogers shall be, and they are hereby declared to be the owners of and entitled to the use of 4.00% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

That the Nicholson Seed Farms, a corporation, shall be, and it is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 46.55% of all of said waters from March 1 to November 1 of each and every year.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that between the first day of November and the first day of March following, in each and every year, the said waters shall be divided between said parties on the following percentage basis:

That Noah Rogers shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner and entitled to the use of 20 percent of all of said water during said period.

That George W. Baker shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner and entitled to the use of 9% of all of said water during said period.

That George F. Croft shall be, and he is hereby declared to be the owner and entitled to the use of 9% of all of said water during said period.

That George and Emory Rogers shall be, and they are hereby declared to be the owners and entitled to the use of 4% of all of said water during said period.

That Nicholson Seed Farms, a corporation, shall be and it is hereby declared to be the owner and entitled to the use of 43% of all of said water during said period.

That Thomas D. Deardon, William Conk, Amanda Conk and Henry Conk, and their successors in interest, jointly, shall be, and they are hereby declared to be the owners of and entitled to the use of 5% of all of said water during said period, and

Joseph B. Dewsnup shall be and he is hereby declared to be the owner of and entitled to the use of 10% of all of said water during said period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all water herein decreed and distributed and to be distributed from water arising in the Sevier River below the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir shall be measured to the respective parties who are the owners of the right to use the same, at what is commonly known as Conk's Dam, and that all cushion water shall be maintained by the respective users at the same level.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the right to the use of the water arising below the impounding dam of the said Gunnison Bend Reservoir allowed to David H. Palmer by the State Engineer of the State of Utah under certificate of appropriation No. 1288, has been abandoned.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all claims to the use of water applied for in applications filed in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah Nos. 2840, 2967, and 3102, which the Sevier Canal Company succeeded to, have been abandoned.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the right to the use of water arising in the Sevier River be-

low the impounding dam of the Gunnison Bend Reservoir, commonly known as the Craft right, and decreed to D. Crafts, et al, in that certain decree rendered in the District Court of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Utah and for the County of Millard in the year 1902, in that certain action entitled "D. Crafts, et al, vs. Owen Conk, et al", and reaffirmed by a decree of said court in the year 1919 in that certain action entitled "Millard County Land & Water Company vs. Abraham Irrigation Company, et al", has been lost, forfeited and abandoned in its entirety, and that none of the water claimed under said right has been used on the land to which it was appurtenant, or at all, since the year 1922.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that as to serial No. 669, commonly known as the Albert Hales right, which was initiated in 1877, and was used on a part of Section 10 in Township 18 South, Range 9 West, in Millard County, Utah; and that in 1920, 1921, 1922, and 1923 the said land was rendered valueless because of the dumping of drain water on it, that since said time the water claimed under said right has not been beneficially used on said land or any part of the same, or at all, and that the owner and owners of the said right have lost, forfeited and abandoned the same, and have no right whatever to the use of the said water or any part thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all of the waters of Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries flowing in the mountains East of Oak City in Millard County, Utah, and the use of the same for irrigation, domestic and culinary purposes, be, and the same is hereby, allocated and decreed as follows: To the Oak Creek Irrigation Company, a Utah Corporation of Oak City, Millard County, Utah, a first and prior right to the use of all of the waters flowing in said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year up to and including a flow of 55.40 cubic feet of water per second of time, with priority date as of 1870. All of the waters flowing in said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year in excess of 55.40 cubic ft. of water per second of time is allocated, awarded and decreed to J. Lee Anderson 1/8th, George H. Anderson 1/8th, Eldon Anderson 1/8th, Don L. Anderson 1/8th, F. Ellis Anderson 1/8th, Willard Christensen 1/8th, Albert Christensen 1/8th, and the heirs at law of the estate of Thomas E. Talbot, deceased, jointly 1/8th.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the said Oak Creek Irrigation Company be, and it is hereby, prohibited and enjoined from diverting any of the waters of said streams and/or their tributaries at a point on Oak Creek above the present points of diversion of the said Oak Creek Irrigation Company, and that each and all of the parties entitled to the use of the waters from said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries be enjoined and restrained from interfering with the

rights of each other to the use of said waters or any part of the same, and enjoined and restrained from interfering with the head-gates and/or diversion works of each other.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Sevier River and its tributaries, for the purposes of this decree in the distribution of the rights herein provided but not including the storage rights in the Piute Reservoir and in the Sevier Bridge Reservoir, is divided into two zones as above stated; that is, Zone A or the Upper Zone, which includes all of that portion of the Sevier River and its tributaries above and including the Vermillion Dam as now located in the Northwest quarter of Section 32, Township 23 South, Range 2 West, in Sevier County, Utah; and Zone B or the Lower Zone, which includes all that portion of the Sevier River and its tributaries below the said Vermillion Dam. The right in each zone are primary to and have priority over the rights in the other zone. The Lower Zone, as herein defined, embraces two sections, one known as the Sanpitch River section, and the other as the Lower Sevier River Section. The Sanpitch River section includes the waters of Sanpitch River and its tributaries. The Lower Sevier River section includes the main channel of the Sevier River below the Vermillion Dam, and its tributaries, other than Sanpitch River.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that, except as herein otherwise specifically provided, all waters herein decreed shall be and are hereby placed upon headgate duty, and the place of measurement of all waters herein decreed shall be as near the point of diversion as is practicable.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that, except as herein otherwise specifically provided, all waters shall be measured to the owners and users thereof as of their respective dates of priority, so that each user or owner of the waters herein decreed shall be assured that his right will be satisfied in full before any subsequent appropriators shall receive any water whatever; provided, however, that where a maximum and minimum right is herein decreed, such prior appropriator shall be entitled only to the minimum right herein decreed, as against each and every subsequent appropriator, until the minimum rights of all subsequent appropriators are satisfied, and provided further that in times of scarcity while priority of appropriation as determined in this decree shall govern and give the better right between those using water for the same purpose; the use for domestic purposes without unnecessary waste shall have preference over use for all other purposes, and use for agricultural purposes shall have preference for use over any and all other purpose except domestic use.

That each of the parties hereto and herein are hereby required to construct weirs or other measuring devices of a design approved by the State Engineer of this state, under the direction and supervision of the commissioner or commissioners appointed by the State Engineer of the State of Utah, and maintain the same

in their respective canals and ditches for the purpose of accurately measuring the quantities of water decreed to them; and thereafter shall maintain and keep all dams, headgates, flumes, canals, penstocks, and other means by which said waters are diverted, conveyed, or used, together with said weirs or other measuring devices in a good state of repair, to the end that no unnecessary loss from seepage or leakage may occur, and that the waters shall be economically applied to the uses for which they are awarded, and all waters diverted from said river and the streams, springs, and tributaries within its drainage basin, by any of the parties hereto, shall be measured at their respective weirs or other measuring devices, and by means thereof.

That the title of the parties hereto to the right to the use of said waters, as herein decreed, is hereby quieted as against each and every other party to this action; and each and every party hereto, their successors and assigns, and their agents, servants, and employees, are hereby forever enjoined from in any manner or at all interfering one with the other in the full, free, and unrestricted use of the quantities of water decreed to them, and from in any manner or at all interfering with each others' canals, dams, or headgates, or from in any manner or at all interfering with the distribution of said water by the commissioner or commissioners distributing the same, or by his or their agents or assistants.


That the rights herein decreed are founded upon appropriations of water for beneficial uses, and the rights herein decreed are subject to the condition that they are required and necessary for beneficial uses, and such rights are subject to the limitations and conditions that the same are used for beneficial purposes, economically and without waste. Any water diverted from the said river and/or its tributaries, not beneficially used under the rights of the respective parties to this decree shall be returned to the river by the most practical and direct route.

Original jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof and of the parties hereto, is hereby retained for a period of two years from the date hereof for the purpose of correcting errors, omissions, and inadvertances which may have crept into this decree, and for all administrative purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that where the period of use of water for irrigation purposes, not including culinary, stock watering or storage rights, is not specified or fixed by the State Engineer's proposed findings or stipulation or stipulations, or by the court's orders, or the court's decree,

the period of use shall be limited to the usual irrigation season, that is, from April 1 to September 30, both dates inclusive, in each and every year.

On page 201, on 35th line, the right of the State of Utah, expressed as an "A" right should be expressed as an "AA" right.

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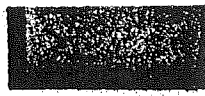
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
