Dear Mr. Long:

This office has been requested by the State Engineer to initiate legal proceedings to have you comply with an order of the State Engineer dated April 8, 1964, relative to measuring devices and control structures on the South Fork of the Provo River.

In reviewing the Engineer's order I find you were ordered to:

1. Complete the upper diversion control gate on the South Fork satisfactory to the commissioner. This includes stopping all leaks around the concrete gate abutments. Installing a steel or metal covered wood gate in existing concrete box which can be closed tight and opened to various heights and set, with a steel stem and wheel lift.
2. Reset the steel gate on its Bunnel Fork diversion in a concrete box or in such a manner that all leaks will be stopped from around the gate.
3. Install a tight steel headgate at its lower diversion on South Fork, before it will be authorized to divert water at that location during a regulatory period.
4. Make the presently constructed suppressed weir at Bunnel Fork operative to the point that it will measure all the water diverted.

The Engineer's office advises me that as of this date you have failed to make these installations.

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If there is some reason for your noncompliance with this order, I would appreciate hearing from you, otherwise I will request the State Engineer to again inspect your diversion on June 21, 1965, and if the above installations have not been made I will file the appropriate action in the District Court.
