RE: MONTEZ DIST.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 15th further referring to the trouble you are, and have, had with the Dry Gulch Irrigation Company officials relative to installing headgates and controls on Montez Creek as per an agreement which you feel has not been lived up to.

In reply I wish to state that I have attempted, by correspondence and otherwise, to be helpful in this matter. In fact, I feel that I have been instrumental in bringing about, in part at least, the headgates which you now state have been installed.

I note, however, that you do not at this time feel satisfied with the construction of these gates, but I feel that I have no further authority in the matter and if this company has not lived up to its contract you should take up with them immediately the matter and see if some adjustment cannot be made that will satisfy the contract. The company, in most cases, has appeared to be willing to meet any obligations they have had and I am sure if you will bring this matter properly to their attention they will take steps to immediately remedy what you call the 'poorly constructed headgates', in keeping with the contract they have with you.
