

THIS CAUSE coming on regularly for hearing before the Court sitting without a jury at a regular term thereof holden at Beaver, in the County of Beaver, in the State of Utah on the 31st day of August, 1931, upon the verified claims filed herein by the several parties to this action, and the Proposed Determination of the State Engineer of the State of Utah made on or about the 17th day of July, 1927 of the water rights of the Beaver River System in Beaver County, Utah, and the several Protests filed herein by the respective parties to this action, in pursuance to the Statutes in such case made and provided, and from the pleadings, stipulations or agreements made in open court it appears:

That the complaint in this action was filed with the Clerk of this Court on the 6th day of March, 1916; that thereafter and on the 19th day of December, 1925 this Court, by written order, ordered and directed that a General Adjudication be made of the waters of the Beaver River System in Beaver County, Utah, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Session Laws of Utah, 1919, and all Acts Amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and further ordered that the Clerk of this Court notify the State Engineer of the State of Utah of such action

and to proceed with said General Adjudication , which said Order was duly filed on the 28th day of December, 1925; that thereafter the State Engineer of the State of Utah was notified of the filing of the above-entitled action, and upon receipt thereof and in pursuance of the terms and provisions of the Statutes of the State of Utah, the State Engineer made a survey of the Beaver River System and its tributaries for the purpose of collecting the necessary data for the Proposed Determination and Adjudication of all of the water rights on the said Beaver River System and its tributaries, and caused to be served upon all of the known claimants to the right of the use of water of the said Beaver River System a notice and summons, requiring all claimants to file with the Clerk of this Court a statement of their claims of the water of the Beaver River System and its tributaries. That in addition to said notice, a notice was published in the Beaver County News, published and printed at Milford, Beaver County, Utah, and in the Beaver City Press, published and printed at Beaver, Beaver County, Utah, two newspapers having general circulation in the District and Territory covered by the said Beaver River System, to all known and unknown owners of the rights to the use of water from the Beaver River System, who had not filed claims or otherwise made any appearance in the above-entitled action, to file their claims with the Clerk of this Court, giving all such persons the regular time in which to file the same, and in the event of a failure to do so, they were to be forever barred and estopped from subsequently, asserting any right or rights to any of said waters of the said Beaver River System. That after the time fixed for the filing of any such claims had expired, the State Engineer of the State of Utah commenced the Determination of the several rights to the use of said waters, and thereafter and on or about the 7th day of July, 1927, he submitted to the Clerk of this Court a Proposed Determination of all of the rights to the use of water from the said Beaver River System, and sent to each of the parties, who had filed claims as aforesaid, a copy of said Proposed Determination, and giving each party to this action ninety (90) days' time in which to file objections to the said Proposed Determination, if any they had; and within said time and

such additional time as was given so to do by the above named Court, the several parties filed objections to specific parts of said Proposed Determination, thereupon pursuant to oral stipulations in open court of the parties who were not satisfied with the Proposed Determination the said action was continued from time to time in order that said parties who were not satisfied might agree upon and stipulate all their respective rights and interest of, in and to the said waters of Beaver River System and all of its tributaries, and thereafter all of the persons and corporations, who had filed claims to any of the waters of the said Beaver River System, by their respective attorneys, or in person, had entered into written stipulations or oral stipulations, made in open court, from time to time, and agreeing to all of their rights of, in or to said water of said Beaver River System and its tributaries, and the right to the use of water from the Beaver River System; and it appearing that the Proposed Determination made by the State Engineer of the State of Utah has been corrected to conform with the settlement made by the respective parties and would be corrected to conform therewith, and that the Proposed Determination of the State Engineer, as so corrected, contains a full and complete determination and adjudication of all of the water rights and the right to the use of waters of said Beaver River System, and showing the date of priority, the names of the several owners, Class of water rights and the acres entitled to water, the duty of water, the amount of water in second feet or acre feet, the several points of diversion, the land to be irrigated, the period of time each year in which each party was and is entitled to the use of said water, and the address of each owner, as required by the terms and provisions of Chapter 67 of the Session Laws of Utah, 1919, and all Acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and the parties to this action having, in open court, expressly waived Findings of Fact and Conclusions of law:

and it having been made to appear to the Court that the Telluride Power Company, a corporation, is represented by H. R. Waldo, Esquire; that the Rocky Ford Irrigation Company, a corporation, and the Duluth Land Company, a corporation, are represented by Messrs. Cline and Cline, and Messrs. Cheney, Jensen and Marr; that the Minersville Reservoir and Irrigation Company, a corporation, and D. J. Williams are represented by Joseph H. McKnight, Esquire, and that all other parties, who have filed claims in this General Adjudication, are represented by Samuel R. Thurman, Esquire, Abe Murdock, Esquire, and William F. Knox, Esquire;

Now, therefore, on motion of said attorneys on behalf of their respective clients, and pursuant to the stipulations as aforesaid, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED, as follows:

That the said waters of the Beaver River System so drawn within the jurisdiction of this Court are distributed under this Decree and are allowed and designated for the beneficial uses hereinafter specified, without waste, to the parties, who have filed claims in title and interest in the amounts, for the purpose, under the conditions, and in accordance with the priorities established and prescribed as hereinafter set forth.

1. TELLURIDE POWER COMPANY, a corporation.

- (a) Priority April 21st, 1904. Power Application No. 95, Certificate No. 38-b. 40.0 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be diverted from Beaver River at a point which bears N. 54° 52' E. 16,022 ft. from SW Cor. Sec. 24, T. 29 S., R. 6 W. by means of a timber crib dam into a pipe line of diameter varying from 34" at head to 20" at plant, and conveyed thereby to the claimant's electrical power generating station in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 24, T. and R. aforesaid and there used during the period above specified for the generation of electrical power for general use in the surrounding territory or elsewhere as the demand may arise. After being so used the water is returned to the natural channel at a point which bears N. 61° 05' E. 3825 ft. from above described SW Cor. Sec. 24.

- (b) Priority May 16, 1907. Power Application No. 1378, Certificate No. 182. 10.0 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be diverted from the South Fork of Beaver River at a point which bears S. 61° 05' E. 13894 ft. from the SW Cor. Sec. 24, T. 29 S., R. 6 W. into claimant's pipe line of diameter varying from 28" to 14", and conveyed thereby to claimant's power generating station in SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 24, T. and R. aforesaid. The water so diverted and conveyed to be used and returned to Beaver River as described in paragraph "a" above.

(c) Priority July 14, 1914. Power Application No. 7401, Certificate No. 1075. 10.0 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be diverted from Dry Hollow Creek at a point which bears N. 89° 37' W. 1785 ft. from the SE Cor. Sec. 19, T. 29 S., R. 5 W. into a 12" pipe line and conveyed thereby to a point which bears N. 87° 15' W. 2986.4 ft. from the aforesaid SE Cor. Sec. 19, and there commingled with the water diverted under paragraph "a" and from there conveyed to the claimant's plant as described in said paragraph "a" and there used and returned as described thereunder.

(d) Priority July 14, 1917. Power Application No. 7404, Certificate No. 1077. 10.0 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be diverted from the East Fork of Beaver River at a point which bears N. 69° 44' E. 2999 ft. from the SW Cor. Sec. 17, T. 29 S., R. 5 W. into a 12" pipe line and conveyed thereby to a point N. 52° 56' E. 2239 ft. from the SW Cor. of said Sec. 17 where it is commingled and conveyed with the water diverted under paragraph "a" above, to the plant described thereunder and used as there set forth for power generating purposes.

(e) Priority July 14, 1917. Power Application No. <sup>7402</sup>~~7401~~, Certificate No. 1076. 17.7 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be diverted from Beaver River at a point N. 57° 42' E. 3566 ft. from the SW Cor. Sec. 24, T. 29 S. R. 6 W. into the Lower Beaver Pipe Line varying in diameter from 18" to 36" and conveyed thereby a distance of 13677 ft. to the claimant's electrical power generating station, and there used for the generation of electrical power for general use in the surrounding territory or elsewhere as the demand may arise. After being so diverted, conveyed and used said water, to be returned to the Beaver River at a point S. 83° 10' W. 7856.8 ft. from the SW Cor. of Sec. 24, T. 29 S., R. 6 W.
- (f) Priority Oct. 4, 1917. Power Application No. 7403 in litigation, Application No. 9631 not yet approved. 50.0 c.f.s. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. 45.0 c.f.s. of said water to be diverted from Beaver River at a point whence the SW. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 29 S., R. 6 W. bears S. 61° 44' W. 3756 ft. and 5 c.f.s. thereof to be diverted from South Fork of Beaver River at a point whence the SW Cor. said Sec. 24 bears N. 71° 20' W. 3563.6 ft. The waters so diverted to be commingled at a point whence the SW Cor. said Sec. 24 bears S. 50° 37' W. 680.1 ft. whence they are conveyed to a point S. 75° 31' W. 2996' from NE Cor. Sec. 20, T. 29 S., R. 6 W. and there returned to the natural channel of the Beaver River after being used at the claimant's proposed electrical power generating station for generating electrical power for use in the surrounding territory or elsewhere as the demand arises.
- (g) Priority Nov. 18, 1924. Power Application No. 9633 not yet approved. 3000 ac. ft. From Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 incl. of each year. Said water to be stored in a reservoir on the natural channel of Three Creeks formed by a dam the center of which will be at a point 2315 ft. S. and 2305' W. of the E $\frac{1}{4}$  Cor. Sec. 9, T. 29 S., R. 5 W. and inundating parts of the following legal subdivisions SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 9; SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 10; NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 15 and NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 16 all in T. 29 S., R. 5 W. Said reservoir to be filled once each year from the surplus flow of Three Creeks and the water so impounded to be released at any time necessary to supplement the natural flow of the stream and allowed to flow down Beaver River to each, either or all of the points of diversion described in paragraphs "a" to "f" inclusive above and used and returned as therein described.

That the users from the Beaver River below the Patterson Dam shall not be entitled to demand any water from above said dam during the irrigation season from April 1st to October 31st until the rights herein decreed to the users from said river at and above said dam have first been satisfied in the amount of 161.31 c.f.s. and until the storage rights of the Kents Lake Reservoir Company and Beaver City in the Kents Lake Reservoir and the South Bench Reservoir and Irrigation Company's storage right in Twin Lake Reservoir as herein decreed have first been satisfied; nor shall the users from the Beaver River below the Patterson Dam be entitled to any water from any tributary, including sloughs and drains, of the Beaver River which enters the Beaver River below said Patterson Dam until the rights herein decreed to the users on each such tributary, irrespective of priority, have first been satisfied to the extent water may be in each such slough, drain or tributary.

## III.

That all the rights herein decreed which are based upon applications made to the State Engineer under the provisions of the Statutes in such cases made and provided are hereby made subject to future continued compliance with the terms of the said applications and to the submission of proofs thereon as required by Statute.

IV.

The entry of this decree and filing of the same with the Clerk of this Court and the State Engineer shall constitute a complete adjudication of the water and water rights of the Beaver River System, as drawn within the jurisdiction of this Court in this proceeding, except as the same may hereafter be modified in the particulars only hereinafter set forth.

V.

That no water shall be stored in the so-called Kent's Lake Reservoirs by the Kents Lake Reservoir Company or by Beaver City, to whom said storage right is awarded herein under Award No. 2, except between April 1st and June 30th of each year, and then only when the aggregate quantity of the water flowing in the Beaver River at the present government gauging station at the mouth of Beaver Canyon is in excess of 161.31 c.f.s.

VI.

That Pine Creek and North Pine Creek and Cove Creek do not constitute any part of the Beaver River System and that the Court in this decree has not attempted to assume jurisdiction or to award rights to the users upon said streams.

VII.

That when and in the event the Beaver Milling and Power Company and the Beaver Woolen Mills, or either of them, shall desire to use any of the waters of the Beaver River for power purposes during the non-irrigation season, such companies or either or both of them may do so only upon the condition that all of the water that passes through the Beaver City Power Plant shall be taken through the Old City Canal and returned to the Beaver River in the manner and along the Course provided in Award No. 12; and it is further ordered that Beaver City during the non-irrigation season shall take the whole of the flow of said Beaver River to the extent of the capacity of the Mammoth Canal for the operation of its power plant. This provision is

made to prevent a division of said water and consequent excessive loss if a part of the stream only is taken for power purposes and the balance of the stream permitted to flow down the river channel.

If compliance with this provision requires enlargement of any part of the Old City Canal or its laterals in order that the entire amount of water aforesaid may be returned to the river, such enlargement shall be made by said Beaver Milling and Power Company or/and Beaver Woolen Mills at its or their own expense.

#### VIII.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that all the rights declared and decreed herein are founded upon appropriation of water necessary for some beneficial use, and all such rights are subject in their exercise to the condition that they are required and necessary for beneficial uses and all such rights are expressly subject to the limitations and conditions that all of such water is used for some beneficial purpose and is used economically, without waste, and with due care, and is reasonably and fairly necessary for such use.

#### IX.

That all the rights declared and decreed herein, are awarded for the beneficial uses specified, and none of the parties hereto, or their successors in interest, whether heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, shall divert any of the waters of said Beaver River System, or any of its tributaries, except for beneficial use, and whenever such use has ceased such party or parties shall cease to divert, and have no right to divert the said waters, or any part thereof, and each and all of the parties hereto, their servants, attorneys, employees and successors in interest, as aforesaid, are forever enjoined and restrained from any and all inter-

ference with, or diversion or use of the said waters, except in the manner, and to the extent, and for the purposes decreed herein.

X.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that each and all of the parties to this action, and their successors in interest, whether heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, and they, and each of their agents, servants and employees, and all persons acting for them, or in their interest, are forever enjoined and restrained from in any manner, or at all, interfering one with the other in the full, free and unrestricted use of the quantity of the waters of said river and its tributaries awarded to them, and from in any manner, or at all, interfering with the distribution of such water by the water commissioner. And each and all of them are likewise enjoined and restrained from in any manner or at all wasting water.

XI.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that any party to this action or his successor in interest who is dissatisfied with any of the regulations, requirements, discretionary acts of control in the distribution, or orders of the water commissioner, may apply to the Court for a review thereof and for relief therefrom.

XII.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that each party hereto shall pay his or its own costs, disbursements, witness fees and mileage incurred in this action.

XIII.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that this Court retain jurisdiction of this cause until and including July 6th, 1932, for the purpose ~~only~~ of making corrections of clerical errors, inadvertences and omissions in the rights decreed.

In all other respects this decree shall be final.

XIV.

The water commissioner shall not distribute water to any of

the parties herein for use upon other lands than those to which the same is appurtenant and for which the same is hereby decreed; unless and until the party seeking to change the place or character of such use shall first have complied with the laws of the state of Utah regulating such change or transfer.

XV

None of the parties hereto shall have any right to divert and/or use water from the said Beaver River System for domestic, culinary, house-hold, irrigation or for stockwatering purposes, except as such right is specifically decreed herein and then only for the purpose and in the amount so decreed and with the priority and subject to the specific terms and conditions herein set forth.

That the period of use for all of ~~such~~ domestic, culinary, <sup>culinary</sup> house-hold and stockwatering purposes shall be from <sup>as a</sup> ~~September 15th~~ <sup>date in the spring as the weather will permit to the 1st of April, and from</sup> ~~until December 15th inclusive of each year, provided, however,~~ <sup>to as late a date in the winter as the weather will permit, provided that said</sup> ~~that no person or company to this decree shall enjoy~~ <sup>any such</sup> domestic, culinary, house-hold ~~and~~ <sup>for</sup> stockwatering right during <sup>a</sup> ~~the~~ period ~~after~~ <sup>when</sup> such person or company is receiving water for irrigation purposes; ~~and provided further that in the event of freezing weather sets in before December 15th so that water will no longer flow in the ditches, canals and laterals, then and thereupon no further water shall be diverted for such purpose or purposes; and provided further that in the case of the North Creek Irrigation Company on North Creek and in the case of the Upper South Creek Association and the Lower South Creek Association, both on South Creek, and the Manderfield Reservoir and Irrigation Company on Indian Creek, the period of use as in this paragraph set forth shall extend from November 1st of each year to March 1st of the succeeding year.~~

The amounts of water hereinabove awarded for culinary, domestic and stockwatering purposes are understood to be maximum amounts and if in the administration of said River System the water commissioner finds in any case that a lesser amount of

water is ample for such purposes, then such smaller or lesser amount of water only shall be furnished to any user.

XVI .

The parties hereto and their successors in interest shall promptly install and perpetually maintain suitable and efficient headgates, control works and measuring devices at or as near as possible to their respective points of diversion, or at such other points as may be designated in this decree, for the measurement of all water diverted hereunder for consumptive uses. Said works and devices shall be constructed and installed in accordance with the provisions of the statutes. All such headgates, control works and measuring devices shall at all times be subject to inspection by any party to this action, and by proper officials having jurisdiction over the distribution and diversion of said water, and no dam or other obstruction to the flow of the stream shall be maintained so as to divert water from the channel of the stream for such consumptive purposes except through ditches or other works provided with such headgates, control works and measuring devices; and each of the parties hereto shall be and they and each of them are hereby permanently enjoined from diverting from the channel of the stream, or its tributaries any water for such consumptive purposes through any ditch, canal, conduit or other device not provided with proper headgates, control works and measuring devices.

XVII.

The quantity of water distributed to any user or appropriator shall be measured at or as near as possible to the point where said water is diverted as herein fixed.

XVIII.

That the diversion, apportionment and distribution of the water of the Beaver River System included and determined in this decree shall be administered in the manner and under the authority of such person or persons as may be charged by law

with the distribution of the waters of the State of Utah, and the costs and expense of such administration, including the compensation and expense of the water commissioner having supervision of the distribution of said waters, shall be defrayed as provided by law.

XIX.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that as between the County Road Drain Ditch Association, and all of the water users on Bullberry Corral Slough, that the County Road Drain Ditch Association shall not claim and is<sup>not</sup> entitled to any water seeping or finding its way into the County Road Drain Ditch between a point 68' W. of the SE Corner of the Mathews pasture and a point 72' W. of the center of the present divider structure situated in aforesaid County Road Drain Ditch near the point where the Bullberry Corral Slough crosses the Beaver-Milford Highway; that all waters seeping or finding their way into said County Road Drain Ditch between aforesaid points shall be water tributary to and belongs to the Bullberry Corral Slough; that the County Road Drain Ditch Association construct measuring weirs at the two aforesaid points and shall at all times measure the amount of water conveyed in said County Road Drain Ditch at the point 68' W. of SE corner of the Mathews pasture and shall discharge over the wier located 72' W. of aforesaid present divider structure only the quantity of water that is flowing over wier at first of aforesaid points of measurement. Further-more said County Road Drain Ditch Association shall provide suitable means and shall discharge into the Bullberry Corral Slough any and all water that might be intercepted by said County Road Drain Ditch between the two aforesaid points. It is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that the County Road Drain Ditch Association and all water users on

Bullberry Corral Slough shall bear equally the cost of maintaining aforesaid measuring weirs and spillway into the Bullberry Corral Slough.

XX.

That in cases where the quantities of water determined to various individuals or companies are too small for practical irrigation purposes, such rights may be combined wherever feasible and rotated among the various users both upon the stream and the various canals in such manner as to deliver to each the total quantity of water they would receive if distribution were made on the basis of continuous flow as outlined in this decree. Where it is not feasible to combine the flow allowed to the several rights, then if practicable the flow distributed to isolated rights may be increased to give a stream sufficient for practical irrigation purposes, and to furnish the amount of water that would be delivered if the continuous flow determined to the right should be distributed.

XXI.

### XXII.

That all persons, firms, corporations and associations herein decreed and awarded rights to the use of water from the Beaver River for power purposes, which are subsequent to other rights herein decreed for power purposes, irrigation and stock-watering or other purpose or purposes, and their officers, agents, attorneys and employes, are hereby perpetually enjoined from so operating his, their or its diverting works and power plant or plants, as unnecessarily to impound, obstruct, impede, fluctuate or unnecessarily vary the free and natural flow of the waters of the Beaver River to which said prior appropriators are entitled respectively at their several points of diversion as herein fixed.

### XXIII.

This court, however, at all times, retains jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof, and all the parties thereto, their successors and assigns, for the purpose of from time to time, making such further orders, rules and regulations as are necessary for the regulation, control and distribution of said waters according to the terms of this decree, and for the purpose of compelling by further decree or otherwise the construction of such improvements, dams, weirs and appliances as may from time to time be found necessary or expedient for the proper carrying out of the terms of this decree and for the equitable and economical distribution of said waters, and for the further purpose of carrying the terms and provisions of this decree into full force and effect, and to punish the parties hereto, their officers, agents and employes, and their grantees and

successors in interest for any violations of the provisions hereof.

XXIV.

That the stipulation and agreement of Telluride Power Company upon which this decree is based is limited to the provisions hereof determining the respective rights of the parties hereto in and to the waters of Beaver River and its tributaries drawn within the jurisdiction of this court by this proceeding, and does not extend to the provisions hereof awarding injunctive relief and retaining jurisdiction in this court for any purpose other than to correct errors as specified in paragraph XIII- hereof, and particularly does not include any consent on the part of said Telluride Power Company to the inclusion herein of paragraphs IX, X, XXII and XXIII, to all of which provisions not consented to by said Telluride Power Company as aforesaid, it has duly entered its objections, said objections being hereby overruled, and the exception of said Company to such overruling of said objections is hereby noted.

XXV.

That the stipulation and agreement of all the water users herein represented by Wm. F. Knox, Esq., and Abe Murdock, Esq., and C. R. Thurman, Esq., upon which this decree is based does not include paragraph XXII hereof, and especially the word "unnecessarily" therein used, to which said provision said water users have duly entered their objections, said objections being hereby overruled, and the exception of said water users to such overruling of said objections are hereby noted.
