Dear Mr. Yardley:

We are in receipt of your letter dated November 15, 1989 concerning a "protest" on the proposed pressurized sprinkler system planned by Beaver City. At this time there is nothing of record to protest.

Beaver City, in their plans, do not proposed to change the point of diversion, place of use or nature of use on the existing water right. If they decide to make any changes to the water right then they would be required to file an application to permanently change those items. Since that has not happened we have nothing on which to post your protest.

We appreciate the concern but until more factual data is available from Reed Mower's report or reports completed by qualified individuals we are not able to draw any conclusions on the possible effects of the proposed system. If you believe the project may be damaging to existing water rights then it would be necessary for you and your group to work through an attorney to take the appropriate legal action.

If you have any questions concerning the water rights we would be happy to assist in finding that information for you.
