WATER RIGHTS

Dear Sir,

In response to your annual letter informing the Kent's Lake Reservoir Board to store your Kent's Lake Water in Three Creeks and Kent's Lake Reservoir. As Secretary, I'm sending you notice that because of a very low snow fall during the winter of 1989 and 1990, there will be no storage water in these reservoirs in the Spring and Summer of 1990. We had a similar, no water storage, in these reservoirs in the Summer of 1977.

We just want to remind Mt. Holly Homeowners Association that when the Utah State Engineer approved Exchange Application Numbers 389 and 390, on July 6, 1971 for 69.52 acre feet of water, the Utah State Engineer's approval was subject to the following conditions:

1. The water must be available to the applicant through the shares in Kent's Lake Reservoir Company and Mammoth Canal and Irrigation Company before any water can be diverted from the Springs or wells.

On second application ~~for~~^{for} 49.99 acre feet, approved on February 18, 1983, by the Utah State Engineer, the second paragraph reads as follows: The water must be available in storage in Three Creeks Reservoir through shares in Kent's Lake Reservoir Company, before any water can be diverted from the existing wells, springs, or North Fork of Three Creeks. All releases made by Kent's Lake Reservoir Company shall be under the direction of the Beaver River Water Commissioner.

The Kent's Lake Board members feel that it is our responsibility to make Mt. Holly Homeowners Association and the Utah State Engineer aware of these conditions.

The Kent's Lake Water shares are not affected. Beaver City and the "A" Water Rights are ~~not~~^{not} affected in these dry years. We just desire to have this information on record in the State Engineer's office.
