

On application of the plaintiff, Provo Reservoir Company, and defendant, Utah Power & Light Company, jointly submitted this day, and agreed to by the said parties through their attorneys A. J. Evans, Esq., and John F. MacLane, Esq.,

IT IS ORDERED that the Water Commissioner heretofore appointed herein be and he hereby is authorized to appoint Taylor Bond or any other disinterested and competent person as Deputy Water Commissioner at \$ 140.00 ^{month} per day, and ~~legitimate and necessary expenses, including the rent or use of an automobile at not to exceed \$ _____ per day,~~ vested with authority and charged with the duty of measuring the flow of the water at the intakes or in the ditches of all users of water between the mouth of Deer Creek and the intake of Murdock plant, and of setting the headgates of all such users so that they will receive only the quantities of water to which they are entitled under the tentative decree or order of court for the administration and distribution of the waters of said Provo River for this current irrigation season, and that said Deputy Water Commissioner shall have all the powers of the Water Commissioner in the premises, but shall be at all times subject to and shall abide by the directions and instructions of said Water Commissioner.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the above named parties, applicants for this water, having agreed thereto that the salary and expense of said Deputy Water Commission shall be apportioned between them in such proportions as the court may hereafter order, until and unless the court shall otherwise provide, reserving the power and jurisdiction to the court herein to make such order for the apportionment of the expense among all the parties to this order as shall hereafter seem proper, which appointment shall continue in force until further order of the court.
