William M. Bestaph, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

1.-- That he is an Irrigation and Hydraulic engineer, and has practiced his profession as such for thirty-five years last past; that during the twenty-nine years last past has spent his time exclusively in irrigation, drainage and hydraulic engineering in the State of Utah;

2.-- That he has made an examination of the soils of Provo City, and the areas adjoining thereto and irrigated under the Provo Water System, and that he knows their needs for irrigation purposes; that he has also made an examination and survey of the soil of that tract of land known as "First Ward Pasture", and that he knows the requirements of said soil for purposes of irrigation; that the soil in First Ward Pasture is of practically the same character as is the soil under the Provo City water system; that it was formed by the same process and is part of a river bed wash, as is the remaining soil under the Provo City water system; that the soil of First Ward Pasture Company requires approximately the same amount of water for irrigation purposes as does the average soil under Provo City's water system.

3.-- That this affiant has had experience in the irrigation of general crops and in the irrigation of pasture lands, and that he knows of his own knowledge that ~~other~~ conditions being equal, pastures require a larger amount of water for proper irrigation than average crops of this region.
