Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of January 28th, and supplemental to my letter of this date you are advised:

1. Relative to the name of John Swift it should be followed by " and as successor to Maray A.Moon", as shown in revised findings, Exhibit "A".
2. The name William Lemon is properly spelled "William L-e-m-o-n."
3. Ola W.Larsen, pleads 60 acres. (Page 13 of your pleadings.)
4. Christeen Fraughton, administratrix of the estate of Henry Fraughton, deceased, as successor to Marshall Leffler as shown by exhibit 196 for 1.25 acres of land, is first class, the quantity of 15.75 acres of land as shown by same exhibit and succeeded to from Henry B.Perry is denominated in the Fulton decree as second class, and is so entered in the proposed Findings and Decree.
5. On page 37, subdivision (c) of Proposed Decree, is as quoted in your letter, this refers to A.S.Carlile--- there is no pleading for Mr. Carlile, as number 34 exhibit 196, this claim is made in the name of Mr. Carlile, and in the Proposed Findings and Decree it is placed in the name of Mary A.White-- Mr. Carlile's predecessor in interest, however, I find upon to-day's examination that Mary A.White pleads but twenty acres, therefore I think it best to ask the Court to allow you to insert the name of A.S.Carlile for forty acres in the pleadings, and change the name in the Proposed Findings and Decree.
6. In your motion to enter pleadings for the names as referred to in my letter of Nov. 19, 1920, you should also move that they be inserted in the Proposed findings as follows:
